Subject: Public hearing & consideration for FY24 budget amendment #2

**BACKGROUND:** On Monday, the City Council will hold a public hearing for a budget amendment for the Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024). The proposed amendment includes amending for \$123,500 in revenue, and \$536,200 in expenditures, and an additional \$1,125,000 in transfers.

This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment for the FY2024 Budget. The City Council previously amended the budget in November 2023. That amendment included amending for the purchase of 1600 W. Broadway Street and conducting a Special Census. At that time, we estimated spending approximately \$900,000 of general fund balance. With the proposed amendment for consideration, I am now estimating the city will only spend approximately \$500,000-\$600,000 of fund balance. Most of this is attributed to conservative revenue estimates.

Of note, one of the largest expenses we are amending for is Public Works capital equipment. In FY2023, the City Council authorized the purchase of a new end loader and plow for the Public Works Department. At the time of ordering (approved by City Council February 14, 2022) we were notified it would take approximately 12-24 months to receive the equipment. The expense was budgeted for in FY2023. We have received the equipment, and this expense is in the FY24 budget, which was not planned.

In May 2023, the City Council entered into a development agreement with the Antler Ridge development to upsize sanitary sewer main through their development for a total of \$450,000. The upsizing of this sanitary sewer main is segment #1 of the Southeast trunk sewer project. A portion of that construction has been completed, and the developer has been reimbursed \$150,000 to date. The remaining construction will take place in FY2025. The city plans to pay for this agreement with sanitary sewer fund balance. Future reimbursement will likely also need to be amended in FY2025.

One proposed amendment is amending the loan proceeds, and amending for the reduction of proceeds for police vehicles. In FY24, the city planned to borrow \$200,000 to fund police vehicles. We will be able to use LOST cash to pay for this expense, instead of funding the expenses with borrowed funds. The borrowed funds will be used for the City Facilities projects, and we may have additional fund balance in that fund after the Fire Station remodel and City Hall is complete. The City Council may review that fund balance in FY2025, and possibly reallocate those funds to a different capital project.

The last 2 years our debt service fund has ended the fiscal year negative. This is because we budget exactly what we need to pay our loan expenses. The issue with the negative balance has been when we don't collect all property taxes on time, and within a given fiscal year. We do collect about 95% of our property taxes within a fiscal year. I am proposing we plan a transfer from LOST to the debt service fund. At the end of each budget year, the Council approves transfers between funds, and as we get closer to June 30, 2024, we will have a better idea if this transfer needs to happen or not.

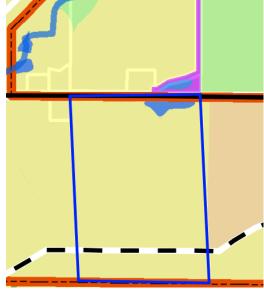
# **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Thomas W. Schlife and Mary A. DeVries are the owners of a 36.58-acre parcel and a 53.93-acre tract of land, located at 1716 E. Northside Drive. The subject property is highlighted in blue on the right. Rock Equity Holdings, LLC. have submitted a signed Petition to Rezone the property on the property owner's behalf to rezone the property from R-1 Single Family Detached Residential to R-1A Single Family Residential. Owners of 95.95% of the 250' buffer surrounding the proposed zoning boundary have consented to the rezoning. The date of the public hearing for this rezoning is set for May 13, 2024.



# **COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:**

The 2016 Comprehensive Plan designated this property, outlined in blue, for low density residential use, which is defined as 1-4 dwelling units per acre. Subsequent amendments to the Future Land Use Plan made no changes to land use on this property. Rock Equity Holdings, LLC. has not requested a Comprehensive Plan Amendment. The R-1A zoning district generally conforms to the low-density future land use as defined in the Polk City Comprehensive Plan.

# **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

Antler Ridge, LLC. has submitted a petition for rezoning for several areas contained within the Antler Ridge subdivision. The intent of these rezonings is to revise the zoning districts to match the proposed lot lines that have been revised throughout the subdivision design process, and to add additional single-family homes. As part of these rezonings, the developer has also submitted a revised Preliminary Plat to show the changes in land use. The revised Preliminary Plat was further revised to remove a turn lane at the intersection of E. Red Cedar Drive and NW 44th Street. This turn lane was shown on the originally submitted Preliminary Plat but was not required by the Traffic Impact Study completed as part of this subdivision. The rezonings discussed above are summarized below.

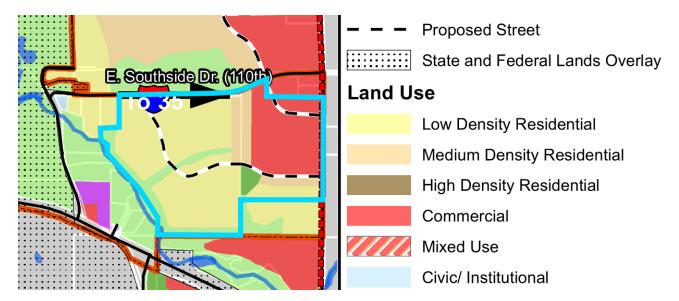

Antler Ridge, LLC. owns a majority of the property within 250' of all three of the proposed areas to be rezoned and has consented to all three rezonings. The date of the required public hearing was set for May 13, 2024.

# **COMPREHENSIVE PLAN**

A Comprehensive Plan Amendment will be required prior to approval of these rezonings, as the proposed layout of the R-2 zoning district, and the change from bi-attached homes to single family homes as the proposed use of the lots does not meet the intent of the medium density designation (4-8 dwelling units per acre) currently shown in the Future Land Use Plan. The Comprehensive Plan will need to be amended to designate the entirety of the residential development within the Antler Ridge subdivision to be low density residential, while the commercial boundary would be adjusted to match the proposed rezoning boundary. Below is an excerpt from the current Future Land Use Plan, the Antler Ridge subdivision outlined in light blue.

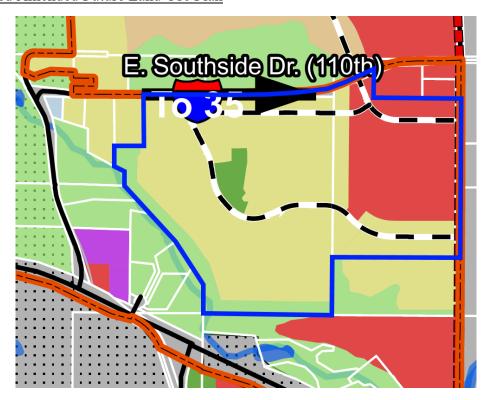

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF POLK CITY, IOWA, BY REZONING OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1920 E SOUTHSIDE DR

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO R-2A ZONING DISTRICT

#### **ISSUE:**

In recent years, staff have met with multiple developers regarding potential townhome projects that are intended to include various combinations of rowhomes, bi-attached townhomes, and/or villas (detached single-family homes within a townhome regime). Some of these concepts include amenities such as a community room, club house, gazebo or playground that would be owned and maintained by the Homeowners Association (HOA) in addition to their typical shared responsibility for private streets, driveways, sidewalks, certain utilities, detention basins, landscaping and open spaces.

In our preliminary review of such concepts, staff typically finds the current R-2A will not work for these townhome projects for a variety of reasons. The developer generally determines that Planned Unit Development (PUD) zoning is the best fit, and often the only fit, for their project. In fact, the only property that has ever been rezoned to the R-2A district is located in Antler Ridge for the planned 43-lots intended to accommodate bi-attached townhomes surrounding the C-2 commercial district, but the developer has applied for a rezoning in this area for R-1A single-family detached homes rather than bi-attached townhomes.

Because the R-2A currently does not allow villas or postage stamp lots for individual townhome units; does not easily accommodate a mix of townhome types in one development; and because members of both P&Z and Council have expressed concern regarding the frequency of developer requests for PUD zoning, P&Z and staff recommend that the R-2A district regulations be amended as outlined below. The Ordinance amending the Zoning Regulations is attached for Council consideration.

#### **CURRENT R-2A REGULATIONS & SUGGESTED REVISIONS:**

Intent. On May 20, 2010, City Council adopted a major update to Chapter 165 – Zoning Regulation that established the R-2A Townhome Residential District. The R-2A district was intended "to provide for the development or redevelopment of medium-density residential areas of the City with townhome dwellings having at least two and no more than six dwelling units in one structure". However, since the time this code section was written, villas have become a more desirable and a marketable housing choice, so it seems reasonable for the city to better accommodate that option. Further, given Council's prior concerns regarding densities, it makes sense for the R-2A to be re-designed to accommodate low density (1-4 du/ac) in addition to medium density (4-8 du/ac) townhome projects.

Amendment #1: Revise the intent of the R-2A district in 165.09-1-D to provide for "the development or redevelopment of low- and medium-density residential areas of the City with rowhomes having at least two but no more than six dwelling units in one structure, villas, and/or a combination thereof, provided all dwellings are included under a

<u>townhome regime</u> providing for common ownership and maintenance responsibilities of facilities and amenities".

<u>Definitions</u>. For reference, the Zoning Ordinance currently includes the following terms associated with townhomes:

• "Dwelling, garden home" means a building containing only one dwelling unit on a separate lot and designed for and occupied exclusively for residence purposes by only one family within a townhome development.

Amendment #2: Update to "Dwelling, villa", "Dwelling, garden home", or "Dwelling, patio home" to codify other commonly-used terminology.

• "Dwelling, rowhome" means any one of three or more residences design for or occupied only by one family within a townhome development which are attached and in a continuous row. Each dwelling is designed and erected as a unit on a separate lot with an individual entrance. All dwelling units must be separated horizontally from each other dwelling by a dividing wall, but may not be separated vertically from each other by a dividing floor or ceiling. No more than six units shall be permitted in a single structure.

Amendment #3: Revise to "any one of two or more residences". This change should help avoid confusion with bi-attached homes which are a permitted use in R-2 and R-3 but are not required to be in a townhome regime in those districts.

• "Dwelling, townhomes" means a row dwelling or garden home as defined herein which is characterized by common elements which are specified in or determined under the rules and regulations set forth by recorded covenants. Said covenants shall establish the guidelines for maintenance of common elements and permit free movement though the common areas by members of the homeowners association to assure access to the structure exterior of each townhome unit by the individual unit owner.

Amendment #4 Revise "garden home" to "villa" throughout code to consistently refer to "villa" as the preferred terminology. Using a one-word term will also simplify sentence structure and table descriptions.

<u>Permitted Uses.</u> The principal permitted uses in the R-2A district currently include:

- Agriculture crop production only
- Civic public or private parks and playgrounds
- Education child care including daycares and preschools

Amendment #5: To be a permitted use with restrictions, restrict to common buildings and not individual residential units.

- Hotels bed & breakfast inn (up to 12 units)
   Amendment #6: Will no longer be a permitted use in R-2A district.
- Residential multiple family dwellings (up to 6 dwelling units per building) including apartments, townhomes, and condominiums.

Amendment #7: Eliminate this use in R-2A to clarify vertically- separated apartments and condos are <u>not</u> permitted in the townhome district since they are more appropriately located, and currently permitted, in the R-3 district.

#### • Residential - single-family, detached

Amendment #8: Eliminate this use since SF homes do <u>not</u> meet the intent of this district which requires all dwellings in this district to be in a townhome regime. (This appears to have been a typo when the new regulations were codified since no bulk regs were listed for this use.)

- Residential single-family *villas* in townhome regime
- Residential townhomes, attached or detached (up to 6 units per building)

  Amendment #9: Revise to "townhomes, rowhomes (2 4 units per building) so that structures with more than 4 units would be permitted only in R-3.

<u>Bulk Regulations for townhomes.</u> The current bulk regulations for townhomes in the R-2A District are provided below, along with the changes proposed by P&Z and staff. Attached to this Memo is a table showing the zoning district and applicable design criteria and/or bulk regulations for the various existing townhome developments in Polk City for reference.

<u>Other R-2A District Regulations</u>. P&Z and staff recommend the following additional modifications and clarifications to the district regulations:

- Density: Application of Note #4, as listed above, and using the current requirement of 3,000 sf per dwelling unit, would allow densities well in excess of the Comprehensive Plan's maximum of 8 du/ac for medium density residential. For that reason, the Min. Lot Area regulator in the Table above includes a maximum density regulator. The table will also include a maximum density regulator for the R-3 multiple family.
- "Postage stamp" lots: Note #4 in the Table above will be revised to make it clear that postage stamp lots are permitted, provided building setbacks and clearances between structures are in conformance with the district regulations. The current note is ambiguous as minimum setbacks and clearances, therefore postage stamp lots are permitted without defined setbacks or clearances between structures.
- Bulk regulations for other principal uses: Minimum Lot Area and Lot Width are included in the above Table. Front yard setbacks will be based on whether the street is public or private. Rear and side yard setbacks will generally be based on the perimeter setbacks unless the structure is internal to the townhome development.
- Garages Amendment #11: Attached garages will be required for each unit in the R-2A district so each row home or villa has their own private attached garage. Common garage structures, such as those in Parker Townhomes, would then only be permitted in R-3 district.
- Private streets Amendment #12: Private streets are permitted, but not required, in the R-2A district provided that all public and private streets shall be constructed in accordance with the design standards specified in Polk City's Subdivision Regulations.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

P&Z and staff recommend City Council amend the R-2A zoning regulations to better accommodate bi-attached townhomes and patio homes provided they are incorporated in a townhome regime, as defined in the enclosed Ordinance.

- **Section 1.** Section 165.03, paragraph 29, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by replacing the clause "occupancy" with the clause "occupancy on a single lot".
- **Section 2.** Section 165.03, paragraph 32, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by replacing the clause "Dwelling, row" with the clause "Dwelling, rowhome" and by replacing the word "three" with the word "two".
- **Section 3.** Section 165.03, paragraph 33, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by replacing the clause "Dwelling, garden home" with the following clause "Dwelling, villa", "Dwelling, garden home" or "Dwelling, patio home".
- **Section 4.** Section 165.03, paragraph 34, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by replacing the clause "garden home" with the word "villa".

  - "D. R-2A Townhome Residential District. The R-2A District is intended to provide for development or redevelopment of low- and medium-density residential areas of the City with rowhome dwellings having at least two and no more than four dwelling units in one structure, villas, and/or a combination thereof, provided all dwellings are included under one townhome regime providing for common ownership and maintenance responsibilities of facilities and amenities. Private streets are permitted, but not required, in the R-2A district."

# **Section 13.** The SITE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS table in Section 165.09, paragraph 6, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the current Note 4 and replacing with the following new Note 4 in the Notes section in the bottom row of said table:

"4. "Postage stamp" lots are permitted in the R-2A and district provided setbacks, clearances, and density requirements are met for the development as a whole. Clearance between structures shall be the total of the otherwise-required setbacks for the adjacent dwellings, based on building orientation and the applicable side and/or rear yard setback for each structure."

# **Section 14.** The SITE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS table in Section 165.09, paragraph 6, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the current Note 5 and replacing with the following new Note 4 in the Notes section in the bottom row of said table:

"5. Minimum lot width is for two dwelling units in one townhome structure, additional interior units shall have 32 feet of lot width for each additional unit."

# **Section 15.** The SITE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS table in Section 165.09, paragraph 6, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by adding the following new Notes 9, 10, and 11 to the Notes section in the bottom row of said table:

- "9. Maximum density calculation for applicable residential districts shall be exclusive of public or private rights-of-way and/or easements for ingress and egress.
- 10. Setbacks on private streets in townhome developments shall be measured from the face of structure to the back of curb or back of sidewalk, whichever is closer. However, in multiple-family developments, setbacks on private streets shall be the same as those required on public streets.
- 11. Where regulated, perimeter setbacks shall apply to property lines on the perimeter of the development and/or to right-of-way lines for public streets whether abutting or

internal to the development. Internal setbacks shall apply to all property lines that are not required to meet perimeter setback requirements."

- **Section 16.** Section 165.09, paragraph 7, of Chapter 165 Zoning Regulations is hereby amended by adding the following new subparagraph to the end of said subparagraph 3-A:
  - "D. In the R-2A district, each villa or rowhome shall have a two-car garage attached to the individual dwelling unit. Detached garage structures serving multiple dwelling units shall not be permitted."
- **Section 17.** All Ordinances or parts of any Ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
- **Section 18.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

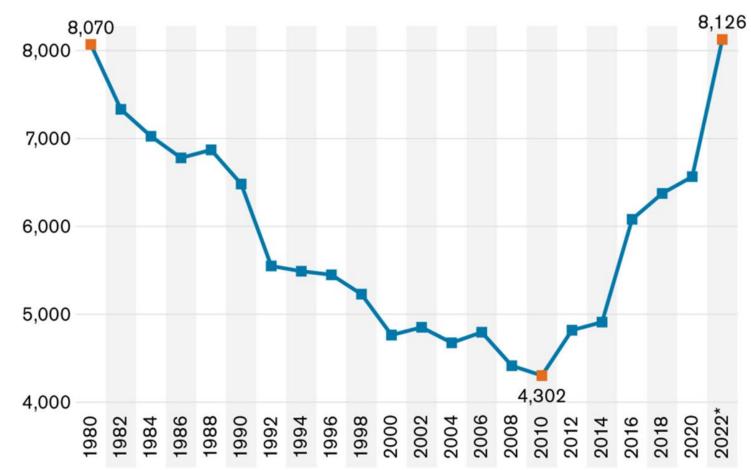

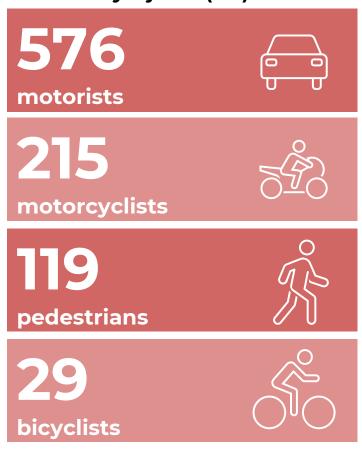

- Rural areas have a higher percent of serious crashes. Ran
   off road was the top cause of rural FSI crashes.
- FSI crashes are more frequent on **weekends** and **dark** conditions. One-third of **rural** FSI crashes occurred in dark-unlit conditions.
- Single-vehicle crashes were 46% of FSI crashes.
- Crashes involving motorcyclists and pedestrians had a higher likelihood of leading to an FSI.

- Half of VRU crashes occurred at an intersection.
- VRU action was entering or crossing roadway in 65% of VRU FSI crashes.

#### VI. Liaison report

New water tower moving forward. It will go out by the new school at Big Creek. An engineering group recommended this area due to high elevation and 40 acres of space. The bid came in under what was anticipated, which is great news.

VII. Board Education: Lisa England/Justin Young

Starting at 6:40

Their space was 22,000 square feet. Our recommend would be 19,000.

Around 12 million final cost- used envision group who was half of another bid, spent a day shadowing staff and walking around library to see.

Each room for capacity around 20, has pushed 30, if not divided between rooms can fit 50's Would recommend having divider walls for meeting rooms to allow flexibility of sizes- make sure to do automatic wall moving instead of manual, as it gets moved every 2-3 days for example.

Got specific donors and funding for specific rooms that they could customize- for example hanging art they did or choose some of the decorations.

Story time room and program room connected.

Cut large meeting room that was going to have council chambers, going to have patio are on 2nd floor.

Got Bissel steam cleaner due to increased traffic, adding coffee area.

Moved up from 6,000 square feet- about 9 years of work

Fundraising- helping at community events, getting out helpers, just have a friends group that all funds funneled through. Individual coffee talks and conversations with people. Initially hired a fundraising firm at a cost of \$80,000 but was not satisfied and let them go.

Staff area with a large storage space-furniture that pulls out with hidden storage.

Drive thru with a book drop off and check out- helps with staff safety to not have to deliver things outside, seniors and moms with kids can quickly come up, has doorbell to help alert staff at front desk to come back if they are helping.

Staff gets their own cabinet area with a lock and a staff bathroom, a break room with kitchen area- no windows on staff break room.

Attached to staff break room is another storage room that can be used with nursing mom area Got a coffee machine that is leased so that company will come fix it, don't have things like.

Carmel and chocolate pumps as teens were filling up cups with syrup.

Had to think about food policy- people started bringing pizzas and picnics, you can have drink with lid and individual snack.

Children's room has storage for all the kids things attached.

Laminate floor in part of kids area- for kid craft times and for groups like scouts that meet Have 30 staff, had 19 previously. Multiple stories necessitated this for safety, have 3 teen pages and one adult page.

Have a separate youth services librarian- glass windows all around to help them watch story times and youth sections.

Rejected desks that were made for them- used Library Furniture International who then got them taken out and replaced and fixed issues quickly.

Sought out sponsors for kids playground area.

Some adult computers by kids ones so parents can work while kids play.

Kit walk for kids to take reader kits and themed backpacks like dolls, stem kits, geology kits.

Family restroom next to children's area, and a sensory room/comfort room with touching things along wall, lights dim and have a big tube down room that can change colors.

Game room/study room with a switch and TV in it that can only be checked out by kids.

Activity tables that can turn tops to be lego, train tracks, x ray. An independent check out station in kids section so parents can check out there.

Donor wall- biggest names for dollar amount.

Teen area separated from young kids- has switches, quest vr goggles.

Can check out games as part of library circulation, can bring own.

Adults on top floor- a fireplace with furniture, digital.

Each study room has slightly different furniture and features, each has a tv, some have multiple desks that can raise and lower. Was an issue with sight lines of not being able to see work rooms over tall shelves.

Computers have desks that can raise and lower so you can stand.

Sponsorships for fireplace area.

Moveable furniture to pull chairs and ottomans together.

Puzzle tables and small areas were sponsored for 1,000 each.

Board game collection to check out.

To start ball rolling- had pictures of spacing issues and things to visualize and show at council meetings.

Did space needs assessment at an early stage- came back as way bigger than knew council would approve, aimed slightly lower.

Then went to renderings.

Offered partnership with the fire department who also needed a new building.

Sell companies on how they can get names out through partnerships- tech companies or engineering to help sponsor maker spaces and tech areas.

Then moved into architect renderings.

Used lost funds, not a referendum, that passed with 81 percent and sent message to mayor Has 70 some parking spots

Lisa went to chamber luncheon- we are aiming for conceptual drawing that would lead to around 20-25 thousand. The mayor mentioned that he was interested in getting a committee of people together to do an arts council and recommended starting a foundation to start building the money. The worry would be that there are so many foundations for things in the town. There is a friends group for the parks for example, but this is not a foundation in the technical sense. The city paid for the conceptual drawing for the sports complex previously. A drawing for the

In your council packets you will find a brush pile check-in sheet that our employees filled out as people came through the gate. Below is a summary of those entries.

317 Vehicles came through the gate in the month of April.

280 had no comment.

25 had negative comments.

13 had positive comments.

73.5 hours of staff time have been used. (This may go down over time as we move from 2 people staffing the gate to 1 person staffing the gate)

The above summary is just the people that came through the gate. Our entire staff has had people stop at the shop facility and ask questions. Out of those discussions, 21 were out of town residents and 6 contractors, they were all told they can no longer use this facility.

We have noticed that the brush pile is a fraction of what it would have been if we would continue as we have in the past. The checkpoint is working, the more out of town people and contractors we remove from using the brush pile the better results we will have. The best proof we will have is at the end of this trial period, when we know how many loads of mulch have been chipped compared to last year's loads.

I believe we are on the right track during this trial period since out of 317 vehicles, 280 had no comment and 13 had positive comments.

Please let me know if there is any other information that we should be gathering for you to make better decisions.

**BACKGROUND:** There were 54 calls for service in April. Part-time Firefighter/Paramedic Joel Otte finished his orientation process and is now cleared to run independently as a FF/Paramedic. Part-Time Firefighter AEMT Kristin Fox and paid-on-call Firefighter/EMT Joe Culham are in their last semester of paramedic class and will be beginning their clinical ride time hours. Part-time Firefighter/EMT Brody Miller has finished his paramedic class and is preparing to test for his certification. He will begin Paramedic orientation with PCFD as soon as he is certified. Full-time Firefighter/Paramedic Riley Noggle is finishing up her Critical Care Paramedic course and will be certified soon. We received our new thermal imaging cameras at the end of the month and have put them in service. This equipment was purchased with funds from the Firehouse Subs Grant.

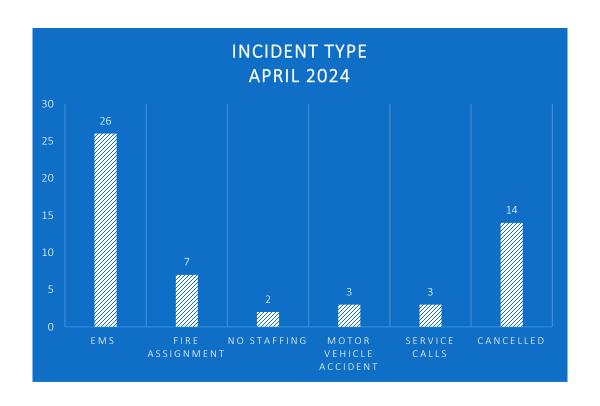

**BACKGROUND:** In the 24/25 budget, we allocated \$58,000 to replace our existing 2019 front mount mower. The 2019 front mount mower only has one use, mowing. It also doesn't have a cab.

The replacement would be much more versatile. It would have a cab so we could use it in the winter and would come with a mower deck, snow pusher blade and a snow blower. We have been looking for a smaller piece of equipment to perform snow removal for our smaller sidewalks around town. This will also function as our mower in the summer to complete tall grass and weed ordinance compliance issues as well as mowing some of our water and sewer main easements. These properties are not mowed under our contract with Total Quality. We will also dispose of our 2019 John Deere front mount mower as soon as the new piece of equipment is delivered.

**ALTERNATIVES:** Do not approve the purchase.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: \$58,000

**RECOMMENDATION**: I would recommend that the Council approve the budgeted purchase of the 1585 John Deere Terrain Cut and attachments in the amount of \$57,911. Further, dispose of the 2019 1445 Front Mount Mower when we receive the new equipment. The purchase will not be made until after July 1<sup>st</sup>, in accordance with the new budget.

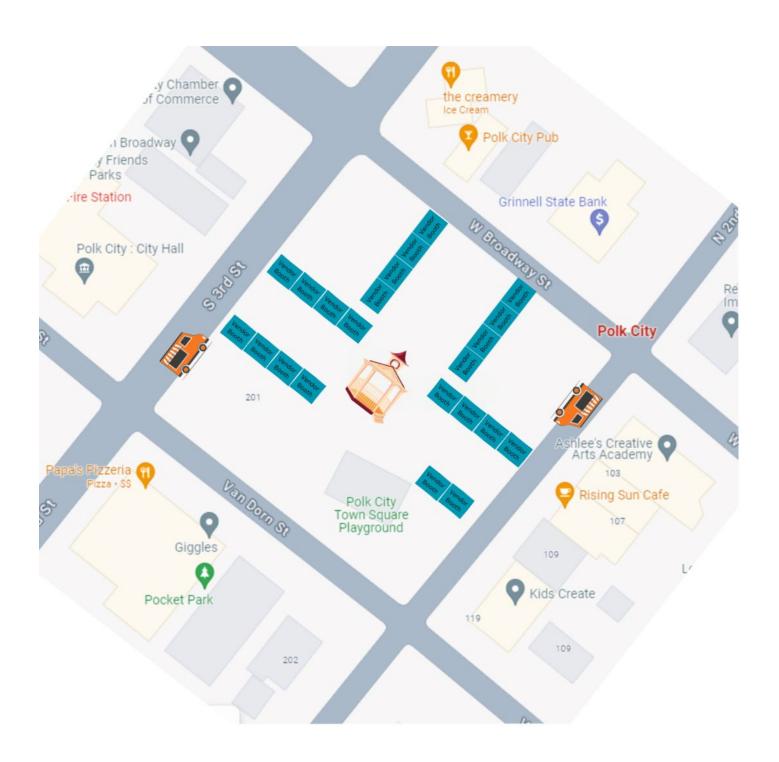

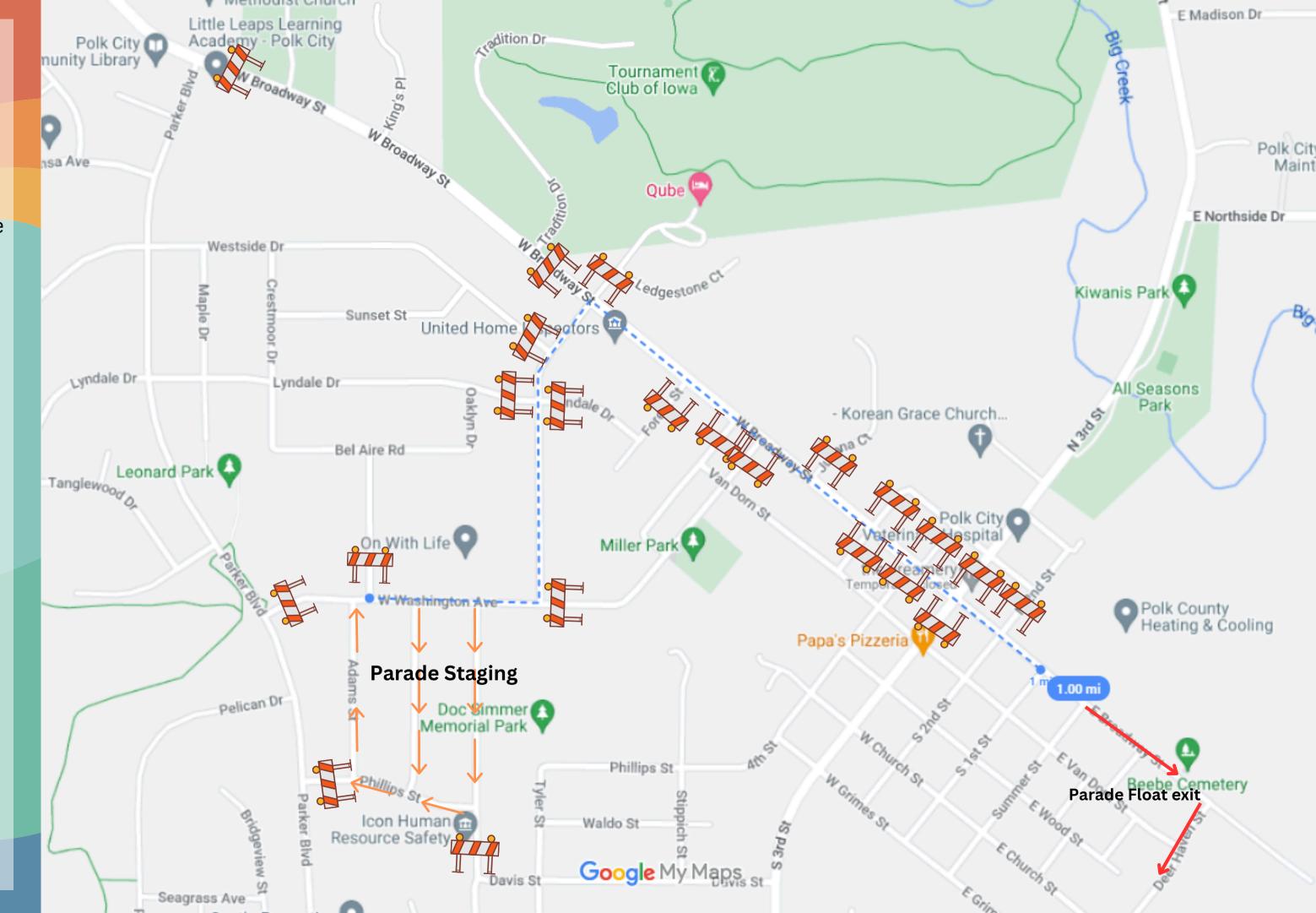

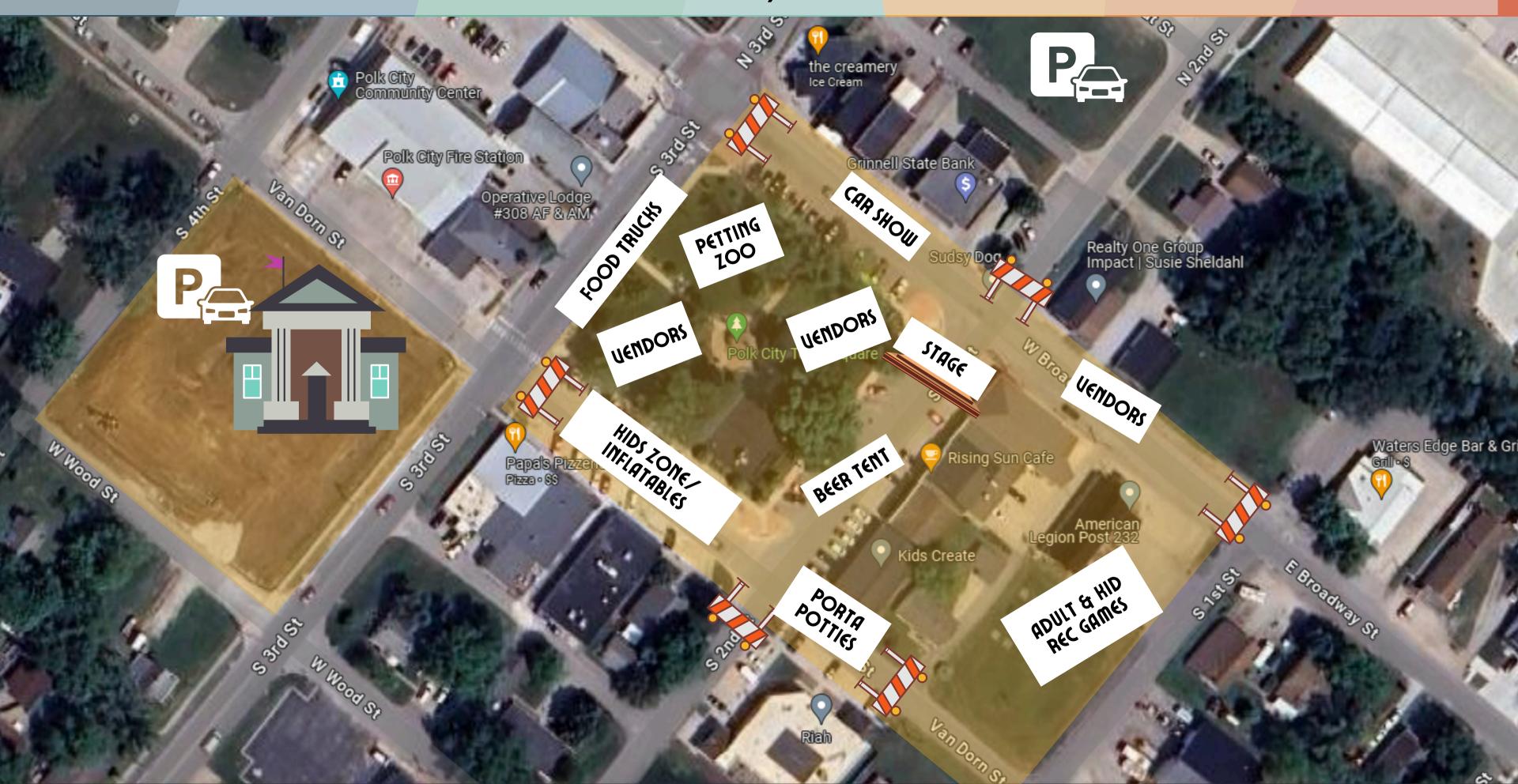

**Subject:** Encroachment Agreement for Lot 15, Big Creek Valley Plat 2

**BACKGROUND:** Big Creek Valley Plat 2 has a detention basin located in the rear yards of several properties within the Plat. With the Building Department taking over inspections from Safe Building, City staff are working to resolve existing issues in relation to easements within this detention basin.

The Private Storm Water Management Facility Easement does not allow construction within the easement without written approval from the City. In efforts to allow property owners to keep the constructed fences while preventing additional cost to the City, the City Attorney has drafted the Encroachment Agreement to allow for a fence located on Lot 15 of Big Creek Valley Plat 2. Any cost associated with removal or relocation of the fence located within the easement for future maintenance of the Storm Water Management Facility is the responsibility of the property owner and not the City.

**ALTERNATIVES:** Do not approve the Encroachment Agreement and require removal of the fence from the easement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: None

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approval of the Encroachment Agreement. The Council may be reviewing other encroachment easements in the future for this subdivision.

#### **ENCROACHMENT AGREEMENT**

This Encroachment Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Polk City, Iowa, as Grantor (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor" or "City"), and Kevin S. WHEREAS, Grantees desire to maintain a fence on a portion of the Stormwater Management Easement on the property (the "Easement Area"); and

WHEREAS, City is agreeable allowing Grantees to maintain a fence on a portion of the Easement Area under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, Grantor is the owner of the property legally described as:

Parcel 2023-42 as filed in Book 19423, Page 950 in the Office of the Polk County Recorder, being a part of the town of Polk City, an Official Plat, now included in and forming a part of the City of Polk City, Polk County, Iowa (the "Property").

WHEREAS, Grantor desires to grant to Grantee an electric easement to be located on a portion of the Property and Grantee desires to accept the easement on the following terms and conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Electric Easement. Grantor does hereby establish, give, grant, and convey to Grantee a perpetual, non-exclusive easement under, upon, through and across the Easement Area, described on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto, to construct, attach, reconstruct, operate, maintain, inspect, replace or remove electric supply line(s) for the transmission and distribution of electric energy and for communication and electrical controls, including other reasonably necessary poles, wires, conduit, duct, transformers, switching equipment, measurement and monitoring equipment, guys, guy stubs, anchors, ground rods, and further including other reasonably necessary equipment incident thereto (collectively "Facilities"), together with the right to survey the Property and the right of ingress and egress to and from same and all the rights and privileges incident and necessary to the enjoyment of this Easement. Additionally, if Grantor provides or installs duct or conduit for said Facilities, this grant

shall cover and include all Facilities installed as a part of the Easement Area

- 2. Erection and Placement of Structures, Obstructions, Plantings or Materials Prohibited. Grantor shall not construct or place any permanent or temporary buildings, pavement, hardscape, structures, fences, trees, plants or other objects on or within the Easement Area without prior written permission from Grantee indicating that said construction or placement will not result in inadequate or excessive ground cover, or otherwise interfere with the Grantee's rights to operate and maintain its Facilities, nor shall Grantor cause or permit any obstruction or material to be placed on or within the Easement Area which violates the clearance requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code and/or the rules of the lowa Utilities Board. No brush, vegetation or other flammable materials shall be deposited, placed, accumulated, or burned within the Easement Area. Subject to the rights of Grantee granted in this Easement, Grantor shall have the right to cultivate, use, and occupy the Property.
- 3. **Change of Grade Prohibited.** Grantor shall not change the grade, elevation or contour of any part of the Easement Area without prior written consent from Grantee, nor shall Grantor place or install any rocking, paving or other hardscape materials in the Easement Area without prior written consent from Grantee. Grantee shall have the right to restore any changes in grade, elevation or contour without prior written consent of Grantor.
- 4. **Violations by Grantor.** In the event Grantor, its successors, assigns, contractors, employees, or agents violates Section 2 or 3 above or otherwise commits an intentional or negligent act, which results in damage to Grantee's Facilities or the Easement Area, Grantor shall be solely responsible for all costs associated with the repair, reconstruction, replacement, and/or work to the Easement Area and Grantee's Facilities.
- 5. Right of Access and Removal. Grantee shall have the right of access to the Easement Area and have all rights of ingress and egress reasonably necessary for the use and enjoyment of the Easement Area from property adjacent thereto. Grantee shall have the right to remove, trim, spray, or cut down any unauthorized fences, hardscape, structures, trees, shrubs, branches, saplings, brush, vegetation, or other obstructions within, upon, across, along, adjacent to and overhanging the Easement Area that may interfere with the proper construction, maintenance, operation or removal of Grantee's Facilities.
- 6. Property to be Restored. Grantee shall repair or pay for any damage which may be caused to crops, fences, or other property, real or personal of the Grantor by Grantee's construction, reconstruction, maintenance, operation, replacement or removal of Grantee's Facilities (except for damage to property placed subsequent to the granting of this easement). For any such repairs required to be made by Grantee hereunder, Grantee agrees to repair such damaged property to the approximate condition of such property existing immediately before being damaged, to the extent reasonably practicable. The cutting, recutting, trimming and removal of trees, branches, saplings, brush or other vegetation on or adjacent to the Easement Area is expected and not considered damage to the Grantor.
- 7. **Easement Runs with the Land.** This Easement shall be deemed perpetual and to run with the land. All provisions of this Easement, including benefits and burdens, shall run with the Property and are binding upon and inure to the heirs, assigns, successors, tenants, and personal representatives of the Parties hereto.
- 8. **Grantor Certification.** Grantor certifies that it is not acting, directly or indirectly, for or on behalf of any person, group, entity or nation named by any Executive Order or the United States Treasury Department as a terrorist, "Specially Designated National and Blocked Person" or any other banned or blocked person, entity, nation or transaction pursuant to any law, order, rule or regulation that is enforced or administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control; and are not engaged in this transaction, directly or indirectly on behalf of, any such person, group, entity or nation. Grantor hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Grantee from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, risks, liabilities and expenses (including attorney's fees and costs) arising from or related to any breach of the foregoing certification.

- 9. Severability, Choice of Law and Waiver. Each of the provisions of this Easement shall be enforceable independently of any other provision of this easement and independent of any other claim or cause of action. EACH PARTY FURTHER WAIVES ANY RIGHT TO CONSOLIDATE ANY ACTION IN WHICH A JURY TRIAL HAS BEEN WAIVED WITH ANY OTHER ACTION IN WHICH A JURY TRIAL CANNOT BE OR HAS NOT BEEN WAIVED.
- 10. Dower, Homestead, and Distributive Share. Grantor hereby relinquishes all rights of dower, homestead and distributive share in and to the Easement Area and waives all rights of exemption as to any of the Easement Area. Grantor understands that homestead property is in many cases protected from the claims of creditors and exempt from judicial sale; and that by signing this easement, Grantor voluntarily gives up any right to this protection for the Easement Area with respect to claims based upon this Easement.
- 11. **IRS W-9 Form.** Prior to any payments referenced herein being made, Grantor is required to submit a fully executed IRS W-9 form to Grantee. Grantor's failure to submit a fully executed IRS W-9 form shall not impact any other provisions or obligations under this Easement.
- 12. **Fee Simple.** Grantor warrants to Grantee that Grantor holds title to the Easement Area in fee simple and Grantor has good and lawful authority to grant the rights provided in this Easement.
- 13. **Headings and Captions.** The titles or captions of sections and paragraphs in this Easement are provided for convenience of reference only and shall not be considered a part hereof for purposes for interpreting or applying this Easement, and such titles or captions do not define, limit, extend, explain or describe the scope or extent of this Easement or any of its terms or conditions.
- 14. **Counterparts.** This Easement may be executed in two (2) or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original for all purposes and all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. Parties may sign and deliver this Easement by facsimile, electronic, or PDF signatures, each such signature to be treated as an original.
- 15. **Entire Agreement.** It is mutually understood and agreed that this Easement covers all of the agreements and stipulations between the parties and that no representations or statements, oral or written, have been made modifying or changing the terms hereof.

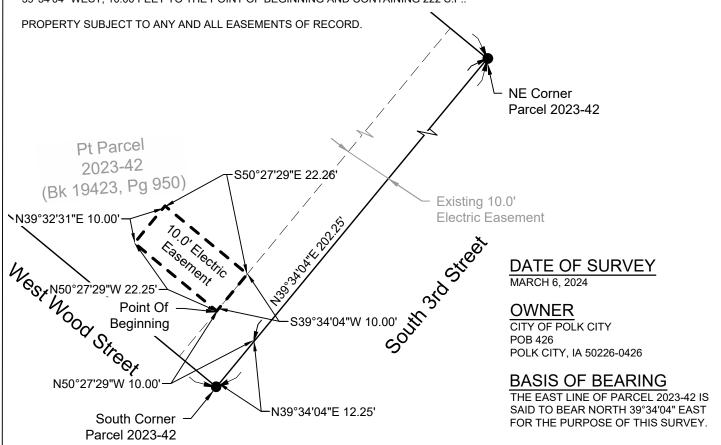

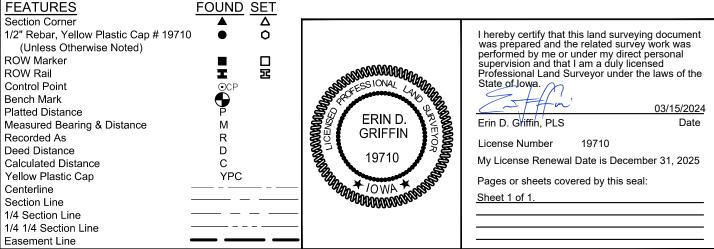

# EXHIBIT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

Financial planning and debt issue development services related to the issuance of a General Obligation SRF Loan, Series 2024A to be issued via the State of Iowa's revolving fund loan program.

- Develop a financing plan in concert with staff which would include recommendations as to the timing and number of series of bonds to be issued and provide advice as to the various financing alternatives available to Client.
- Develop alternatives related to debt transactions including evaluation of revenues available, maturity schedule and cash flow requirements.
- Identify key bond covenant features and advise as to the financial consequences
  of provisions to be included in bond resolutions regarding security, creation of
  reserve funds, flow of funds, redemption provisions, additional parity debt tests,
  etc.; review and comment on successive drafts of bond resolutions.
- Review the terms, conditions and structure of any proposed debt offering undertaken by Client and provide suggestions, modifications and enhancements where appropriate and necessary to reflect the constraints or current financial policy and fiscal capability.

This review, together with employing the resources described above, allows Us to evaluate any situations that may be an actual or potential conflict of interest.

**Disclosures.** We will disclose to clients those situations that We believe would create a material conflict of interest, such as: 1) any advice, service or product that any affiliate may provide to a client that is directly related to the municipal advisory work We perform for such client; 2) any payment made to obtain or retain a municipal advisory engagement with a client; 3) any fee-splitting arrangement with any provider of an investment or services to a client; 4) any conflict that may arise from the type of compensation arrangement We may have with a client; and 5) any other actual or potential situation that We are or become aware of that might constitute a material conflict of interest that could reasonably expect to impair Our ability to provide advice to or on behalf of clients consistent with regulatory requirements. If We identify such situations or circumstances, We will prepare meaningful disclosure that will describe the implications of the situation and how We intend to manage the situation. We will also disclose any legal or disciplinary events that are material to a client's evaluation or the integrity of Our management or advisory personnel. We will provide this disclosure (or a means to access this information) in writing prior to starting Our proposed engagement, and will provide such additional information or clarification as the client may request. We will also advise Our clients in writing of any subsequent material conflict of interest that may arise, as well as the related implications, Our plan to manage that situation, and any additional information such client may require.

From time to time, We may be compensated by a municipal advisory fee that is or will be set forth in an agreement with the client to be, or that has been, negotiated and entered into in connection with a municipal advisory service. Payment of such fee may be contingent on the closing of the transaction and the amount of the fee may be based, in whole or in part, on a percentage of the principal or par amount of municipal securities or municipal financial product. While this form of compensation is customary in the municipal securities market, it may be deemed to present a conflict of interest since We may appear to have an incentive to recommend to the client a transaction that is larger in size than is necessary. Further, We may also receive compensation in the form of a fixed fee arrangement. While this form of compensation is customary, it may also present a potential conflict of interest, if the transaction requires more work than contemplated and We are perceived as recommending a less time consuming alternative contrary to the client's best interest so as not to sustain a loss. Finally, We may contract with clients on an hourly fee basis. Pursuant to various employee compensation structures, from time to time We offer certain of Our registered municipal advisors ("Registered Advisors") financial benefits based on his or her business plan, client base, performance, and/or transactions closed. This provides an incentive for such Registered Advisors to seek to retain additional clients and/or transactions or services from clients. While this form of compensation may be customary in some segments of the municipal advisory market, provision of such financial benefits may be deemed to present a conflict of interest. We manage and mitigate these types of conflicts by Registered Advisor's adherence to Our Code of Ethics and Policies and Procedures, and by requiring that there be a review of the municipal securities transaction or municipal financial product to ensure that it is suitable for the client in light of various factors, after reasonable inquiry, including the client's needs, objectives and financial circumstances.

# Disclosure Concerning Provision of Services to State and Local Government, and Non-Profit Clients

We regularly provide financial advisory services to state and local governments, their agencies, and instrumentalities, and non-profit clients. The notice shall be in substantially the following form:

# NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE PROCEEDINGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AND DISBURSEMENT AGREEMENT AND TO BORROW MONEY THEREUNDER IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,800,000 (GENERAL OBLIGATION)

The City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa, will meet on May 28, 2024, at the City Hall Council Chambers in Polk City, Iowa, at 6 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action to enter into a loan and disbursement agreement (the "Agreement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,800,000, for the purpose of paying the cost, to that extent, of planning, designing and constructing improvements and extensions to the Municipal Waterworks Utility System of the City.

The Agreement will constitute a general obligation of the City and is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa.

This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Subject:** Nuisance abatement appeal

**BACKGROUND:** On April 24, 2024, while attempting to make contact with the property owners of 701 Waldo Street to discuss several nuisances that were reported to me regarding junk and unapproved surface parking I discovered that the owner, Kristina McKinzie, also had chickens on the property in violation of municipal code 55.05. Had I not gone to their side door to contact Kristina to discuss the other violations I would not have discovered the Chickens. They were contained in a cage inside the rear yard of the property that is concealed with a privacy fence, the gate to that privacy fence was left open allowing me to see them. This is also not the first occasion I have had to address several nuisance issues on this property with the owner.

After speaking with Kristina about all the violations that were found on the property, she explained that the chickens were her son's pets. I explained to her that their removal would be part of the abatement order but she does have the option to seek written consent of the Council to keep them as it is outlined in Municipal Code 55.05.

Kristina has requested to speak with Council hoping to reverse the abatement order for the Municipal Code violation 55.05 *Livestock*.

**ALTERNATIVES:** Appeal the abatement order of Municipal Code violation 55.05.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:** There are no financial considerations in this matter.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Municipal Code 55.05 states that it is unlawful for a person to keep livestock within the City expect by written consent of the Council or except in compliance with the City's zoning regulations. Chickens are included in the definition of "Livestock". It is up to Council to either grant written permission for the Chickens to be allowed or uphold the abatement order and require them to be removed.

If the Council does choose to reverse the abatement order on the chickens I would recommend they consider setting parameters on how they would be allowed to stay in the City. Things to consider include quantity, type of confinement/cage, location within the property (how close to property lines should they be allowed), type of chickens (no roosters), lot size requirements.

The City of Ankeny does allow Urban Chickens but they are only if certain requirements are met. The following are the requirements the City of Ankeny has in place for Urban Chickens for your information:

- Resident must complete eCourse on raising chickens in an urban setting
- Must apply and obtain a permit from the city to keep them (\$100/year permit fee)
- Max of 6 hens allowed- no roosters
- Resident must live in a single family home with a lot size of at least 1/4 acre
- Henhouse or pens must be at least 25 feet away from property lines
- Chickens must be kept in enclosures or fenced areas at all times
- Must ensure that odors and noise do not impact neighbors
- Must meet specific requirements for the storage and removal of chicken waste
- Permit does not allow commercial activities such as breeding

Over the last few years, the city has had to increase water rates for Polk City residents every fiscal year. Most of these proposed rate increases have been attributed to the cost of purchasing water from Des Moines Water Works. The proposed rate increase for FY2025 will include the new costs associated with becoming a member of Central Iowa Water Works (the new water governance entity) and also construction of the new 1.5-million-gallon tower.

There shall be a \$100 \$150.00 deposit required from every customer that is not the owner of the premises being served. The deposit is intended to guarantee the payment of bills for service. Provided, however, if the customer is the owner of the premises and elects to have payments of bills for service automatically withdrawn from their bank account through the automatic clearinghouse procedure, the customer deposit shall be waived.
- **Section 4.** All Ordinances or parts of any Ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

**BACKGROUND:** The City Council held a work session on Monday, April 8, 2024, to discuss the Temporary Sign Ordinance. The Temporary Sign Ordinance was amended several years ago, and placed limitations on temporary signage throughout the community. At the work session, the City Council discussed increasing the number of temporary signs allowed for both non-profits and businesses in Polk City.

Based on feedback I received from the work session, I believe the Council wants to increase the number of signs within a year allowed to non-profits and businesses. The number does need to be the same for all users. The temporary signage ordinance currently allows for 2 per year. For Monday's meeting, I have increased this to 6 based on feedback I've received, but the Council may decrease or increase that number during the 1<sup>st</sup> reading discussion. The current ordinance also allows for temporary signs to only be up for a period of 10 days, and I have increased that to 30 based on feedback received. Again, the Council may decrease or increase that number.

Finally, the City Council did discuss waiving the \$25 permit fee for non-profit temporary sign permits. City staff has incorporated the waived fee into the updated City Fees schedule, listed as consent item Q on the May 13, 2024, City Council agenda.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the 1st reading of the proposed Ordinance

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The financial considerations for the proposed change are minimum.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is my recommendation that the City Council approve the 1<sup>st</sup> reading of an Ordinance related to temporary signs.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF POLK CITY, IOWA BY AMENDING CHAPTER 166 SIGNS, SECTION 166.21 TEMPORARY SIGNS

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa as follows:

**Section 1.** Section 166.21, Temporary Signs is hereby amended by deleting the section and inserting the following:

166.21 Temporary Signs.

- 1. Temporary Signs in Commercial and Industrial zoning districts and for permitted non-residential uses in Residential zoning districts shall require a temporary sign permit and shall conform to the following regulations:
  - A. Temporary signs shall be limited to six events per year for any one business. Each temporary sign event shall last for a period of not more than 30 days and shall not exceed six occurrences in a calendar year. In conjunction with a temporary Site Plan, the Council may permit the display of temporary signs for a greater period of time.
  - B. Grand openings for new business shall be permitted one temporary sign for a period of not more than 60 days.
  - C. Temporary building signs shall be no larger than 100 square feet. Temporary free-standing signs shall be no longer than 32 square feet in area and have a minimum sign setback of five feet.
- 2. Temporary signs in Residential zoning district shall not require a temporary sign permit provided such signs conform to the following regulations:
  - A. Temporary freestanding signs shall be no larger than four square feet in size and have a minimum sign setback of five feet. Such signs shall be limited to five per yard. Each temporary sign shall last for a period of not more than three months per year.
    - B. Temporary building signs are not permitted.
- 3. Temporary free-standing signs for new subdivisions shall require a temporary sign permit and shall confirm to the following regulations:
  - A. Such temporary signs shall not exceed 32 square feet on each face, with a maximum of two faces per sign.
  - B. In residential districts, real estate/project identification signs shall be limited to one sign per subdivision unless the subdivision has more than 1,000 feet of frontage along one public street, in which case no more than two real estate/project identification signs are permitted. Said sign shall be removed before issuance of the final building permit in the subdivision.
  - C. In commercial and industrial districts, real estate/project identification signs shall be limited to one sign for each lot listed which shall be removed before issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the lot on which the sign is located.
- 4. Under no circumstances shall any temporary sign be located on public property or affixed to a utility pole or appurtenance located within a public utility easement.

- **Section 2**. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- **Section 3.** If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
