Subject: Public hearing on Urban Renewal Plan amendment & Resolution amending the Urban

Renewal Plan

BACKGROUND: On Monday evening, the City Council will hold a Public Hearing on a proposed amendment to the City's Urban Renewal Plan-Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area. The plan amendment is to 1) Add the Faction Investments project at 1010 Tyler Street 2) Increase the Administrative Support Program and 3) Add a new downtown improvement grant program.

- 1. Faction Investments is building a new commercial business at 1010 Tyler Street. The estimated cost of the project is \$3,000,000. The Council would need to amend, and later approve a development agreement with up to \$484,000 in tax increment financing incentives. The tax incentives align with the City's Economic Development Policy and would be offered through a rebate over an 8-year period to the developer.
- 2. The city currently has an administrative support program using tax increment financing. The current program is not to exceed \$250,000 of TIF money for urban renewal activities. Some of the expenses we cover with TIF include a portion of the City Managers salary, our retainer agreement with PFM and our Bond Counsel expenses. I would like to increase the amount of the administrative support program not to exceed \$500,000. This will provide the City with some additional funding for the City's general fund and cover urban renewal and economic development related expenses.
- 3. The last item I would propose we amend for is a future downtown grant assistance program. The City Council will discuss this item at Monday's work session, but this program would offer grant assistance to businesses in the Town Square to make exterior improvements to their buildings. The city would offer assistance through TIF funding. I am recommending the Council include this in the amendment, and a separate program would be approved at a later date. I recommend the amendment not exceed \$250,000 for this program over a 5-year period.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the urban renewal plan.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The financial considerations for this amendment are \$784,000. This includes tax incentives for the development agreement, which the City Council will still have to review and

consider at a future meeting, an additional \$250,000 for the administrative support program, and \$250,000 for a downtown grant program implementation.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approve the amendment to the Urban Renewal Plan.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-131

Resolution to Approve Urban Renewal Plan Amendment for the Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area

WHEREAS, as a preliminary step to exercising the authority conferred upon Iowa cities by Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa (the "Urban Renewal Law"), a municipality must adopt a resolution finding that one or more slums, blighted or economic development areas exist in the municipality and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development or a combination thereof, of such area or areas is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, this City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa (the "City"), by prior resolution established the Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and adopted an urban renewal plan (the "Plan") for the governance of projects and initiatives therein; and

WHEREAS, an amendment (the "Amendment") to the Plan has been prepared which (1) updates the description of the City's Urban Renewal Administration and Professional Support Program previously approved in the October, 2020 and November, 2022 Amendments to the Plan; and (2) authorizes the undertaking of new urban renewal projects in the Urban Renewal Area consisting of (a) providing tax increment financing support to a private developer in connection with the construction of a new commercial strip mall building; and (b) using tax increment financing to pay the costs of the City's Downtown Revitalization Incentive Support Program; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing by the City Council on the proposed Amendment was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and the Council has conducted said hearing on November 13, 2023; and

WHEREAS, copies of the Amendment, notice of public hearing and notice of a consultation meeting with respect to the Amendment were mailed to Polk County and the North Polk Community School District; the consultation meeting was held on the 24 day of October 2023; and responses to any comments or recommendations received following the consultation meeting were made as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The Amendment, attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby in all respects approved.
 - Section 2. It is hereby determined by this City Council as follows:
 - A. The programs, projects and initiatives proposed under the Amendment conform to the general plan for the development of the City;

Passed and approved November 13, 2023.

- B. The programs, projects and initiatives proposed under the Amendment are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the City in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.
- C. It is not intended that families will be displaced as a result of the City's undertaking under the Amendment. Should such issues arise with future projects, then the City will ensure that a feasible method exists to carry out any relocations without undue hardship to the displaced and into safe, decent, affordable and sanitary housing.
- Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

Resolution Setting a Date of Meeting at Which it is Proposed to Approve a Development Agreement with Faction Investments, LLC, Including Annual Appropriation Tax Increment Payments

WHEREAS, the City of Polk City, Iowa (the "City"), pursuant to and in strict compliance with all laws applicable to the City, and in particular the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, has adopted an Urban Renewal Plan for the Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area"); and

WHEREAS, this City Council has adopted an ordinance providing for the division of taxes levied on taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa and establishing the fund referred to in Subsection 2 of Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, which fund and the portion of taxes referred to in that subsection may be irrevocably pledged by the City for the payment of the principal of and interest on indebtedness incurred under the authority of Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to enter into a development agreement (the "Development Agreement") with Faction Investments, LLC (the "Company") in connection with the construction by the Company of a new commercial strip mall building in the Urban Renewal Area; and

WHEREAS, the Development Agreement would provide financial incentives to the Company in the form of annual appropriation incremental property tax payments in an amount not to exceed \$484,000 under the authority of Section 403.9(1) of the Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to set a date for a public hearing on the Development Agreement, pursuant to Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa;

NOW THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. This City Council shall meet on December 11, 2023, at 6 p.m., at the City Hall Council Chambers in the City, at which time and place proceedings will be instituted and action taken to approve the Development Agreement and to authorize the annual appropriation incremental property tax payments.
- Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the proposed action, the time when and place where said meeting will be held, by publication at least once not less than four (4) and not more than twenty (20) days before the date of said meeting in a legal newspaper of general circulation in the City. Said notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF MEETING FOR APPROVAL OF DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH FACTION INVESTMENTS, LLC AND AUTHORIZATION OF ANNUAL APPROPRIATION TAX INCREMENT PAYMENTS

The City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa, will meet at the City Hall Council Chambers on December 11, 2023, at 6 p.m., at which time and place proceedings will be instituted and action taken to approve a Development Agreement between the City and Faction Investments, LLC (the "Company") in connection with the construction by the Company of a new commercial strip mall building in the Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area. The Development Agreement provides for certain financial incentives in the form of incremental property tax payments to the Company in a total amount not exceeding \$484,000 as authorized by Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa.

The commitment of the City to make incremental property tax payments to the Company under the Development Agreement will not be a general obligation of the City, but such payments will be payable solely and only from incremental property tax revenues generated within the Polk City Area II Urban Renewal Area. Some or all of the payments under the Development Agreement may be made subject to annual appropriation by the City Council.

At the meeting, the City Council will receive oral or written objections from any resident or property owner of the City. Thereafter, the City Council may, at the meeting or at an adjournment thereof, take additional action to approve the Development Agreement or may abandon the proposal.

This notice is given by order of the City Council of Polk City, Iowa, in accordance with Section 403.9 of the Code of Iowa.

Subject: Parks & Recreation Department Updates for October 2023

- 1. Staff presented at the Citizen's Academy on October 7th. Presentation included information on parks, trails, programming, CIP projects, and volunteer opportunities.
- 2. Staff attended NRPA Annual Conference October 9th 12th. Topics covered included: Public Engagement, Outdoor Recreation, User Group Policy, Uncomfortable Conversations, Staff Development, Placemaking, Master Planning, Effective Communication, Public/Private Collaboration, Special Events, Ballot and Bonding Issues, Programming, Increasing Park Use, and Round Table Discussions.
- 3. Mitch Braiser, Eagle Scout candidate, began his service project at Twelve Oaks Park and Marina Cove Park. Mitch's project consists of constructing and placing a new information board at each park. Displays will include information about urban fishing and stormwater detention.
- 4. Staff worked with Luana Savings Bank, Kiwanis Club of Polk City, and Polk City Friends of the Parks to replace the field #1 and Field #2 scoreboards at the sports complex. Luana Savings Bank will sponsor the field #1 scoreboard in full while the field #2 scoreboard will be co-sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Polk City and Polk City Friends of the Parks.
- 5. October programming included Start Smart Football, Youth Flag Football, Senior Social Hour, and a Senior Day Trip.
- 6. Sports Complex baseball/softball fields had 10 reservations in October. 170 total field reservations in 2023.
- 7. Miller Park Shelter House had 8 private rentals in October. 43 total rentals in 2023.

MEETING MINUTES

The City of Polk City Parks Commission 6:00 p.m., Monday, November 6, 2023 City Hall

The Polk City Parks Commission held a meeting at 6:00 p.m., on November 6, 2023. The agenda was posted at the City Hall Office as required by law. These tentative minutes reflect all action taken at the meeting.

- 1. Call to Order | The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.
- 2. <u>Roll Call</u> | Delaney, Savage, Ten-Napel, Haaland (by phone), Otis, Jablonski | In attendance Converse | Absent
- 3. *MOTION*: A motion was made by Savage and seconded by Ten-Napel to approve the October 2, 2023 meeting minutes. *MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY*
- 4. Audience Items: None
- 5. Presentation by Josh Faber, Renaissance Group, Inc.

Faber is the head of RGI, the consultant that was hired by the City to conduct a feasibility study and design a capital campaign for the Regional Park Project. His presentation covered aspects of the pre-campaign process, specifically: planning, leadership development, education and targeted communication with potential donors, and conducting the feasibility study. Savage asked how potential donors are identified, Faber responded that it varies by project type and community. Savage asked about economic headwinds facing a project of this sort, Faber responded that they've gone from depending on the top 100-150 donors to the top 40-50 to make or break a project. Jablonski asked about naming rights and how to approach that topic with donors. Faber responded that that's not really part of the pre-campaign phase but would come during the actual campaign when we're asking for money. Delaney asked what the small group meetings would look like. Faber responded that a lot of the meetings will be one-on-ones.

6. Discuss Park Commission Action Plan

Discussion of an Action Plan for the Parks Commission continued. Main points of contention included: unclear duties, roles, and responsibilities, communication from Council and Staff, opportunities to consult and be informed. Savage suggested the use of a RACI chart to aid in deciding roles on Parks related issues. Discussion was had about potentially moving to quarterly meetings. Discussion was tabled so Commissioners could compile a list of tangibles to ask Council for.

BACKGROUND & DESCRIPTION:

The subject property was rezoned to a Planned Unit Development on January 9, 2023. The P.U.D. Master Plan was subsequently approved on March 27, 2923. On March 20, 2023, P&Z recommended approval of the Preliminary Plat/Site Plan which was then approved by City Council on March 27, 2023.

Since the submitted Final Plat is in conformance with the approved Preliminary Plat/Site Plan, there is no need for a recommendation from P&Z on the Final Plat. At this time, the applicant requests approval of the Final Plat so that a Building Permit can be issued for the Senior Living Center.

As approved at the time of rezoning and noted on the P.U.D. Master Plan, the parkland dedication for this senior living center is 50,285 square feet, or 1.154 acres. Based on a fair market value of \$93,000 per acre, the parkland dedication fee will be in the amount of \$107.357.78 for Leonard Senior Living Plat 1.

In conjunction with the Parker Boulevard improvements project, Clifford Leonard signed a Public Improvement and Fee Allocation Agreement. The final fee allocation attributable to this property is \$50,838.00 which was paid in full to the City of Polk City on July 11, 2023.

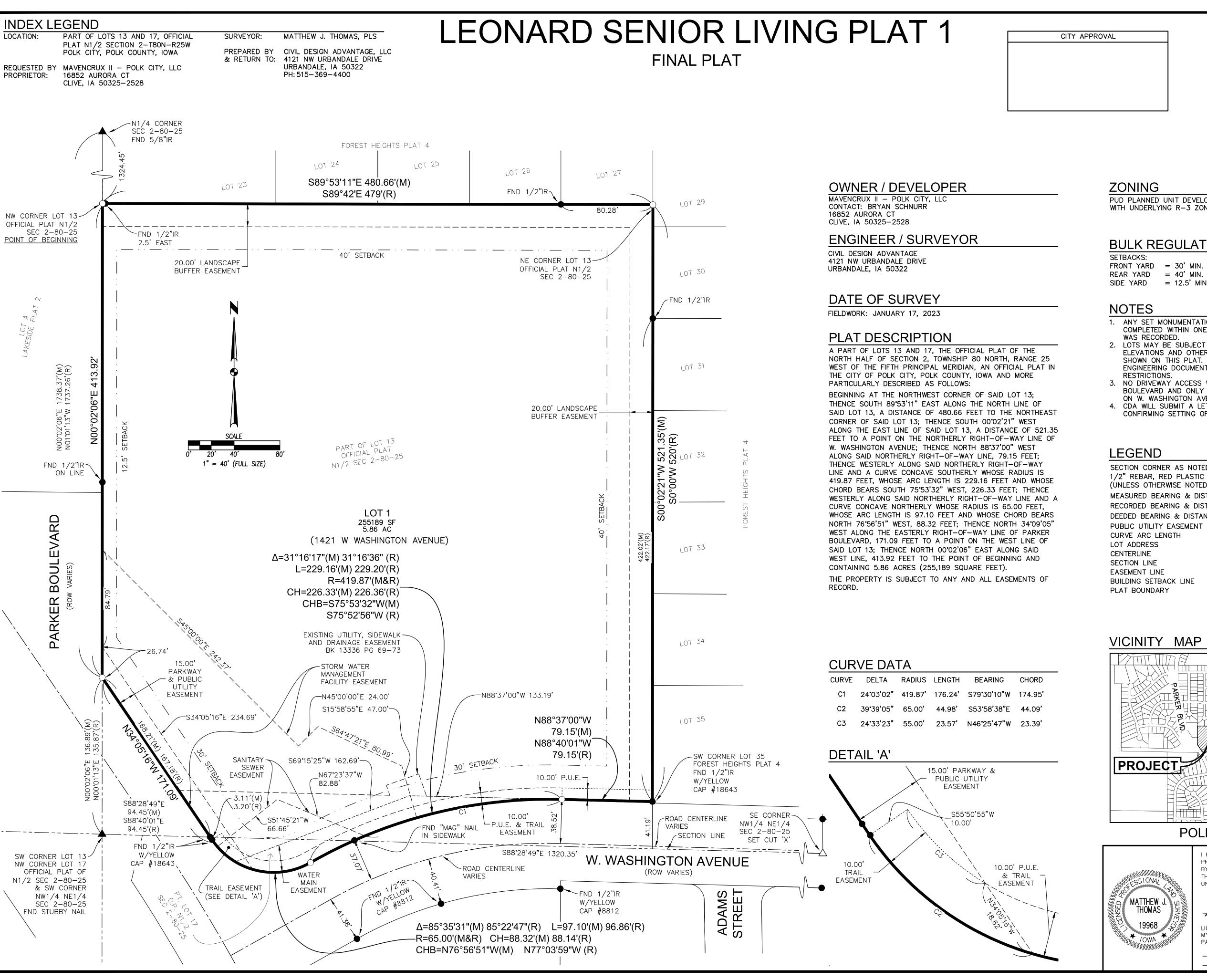
FINAL PLAT REVIEW COMMENTS: All of staff's comments on the Final Plat have been addressed, with the exception of the following:

- 1. The real estate transfer from Bryan Schurr to MavenCrux II Polk City, LLC will need to be completed prior to recordation of the Final Plat and accompanying documents.
- 2. The City Attorney has reviewed the following easements which will need to be signed by the developer prior to Council action on the Final Plat:
 - a. Storm Water Management Facility Maintenance Covenant and Permanent Easement Agreement
 - b. 15' Parkway Easement
 - c. Public Utility Easements
 - d. Sanitary Sewer Easement
 - e. Water Main Easement
 - f. Recreational Trail Easement
 - g. 20' Buffer Landscape Buffer Easement
- 3. The City Attorney will need to approve all platting legal documents including Title Opinion, Consent to Plat, and Certificate of Treasurer.
- 4. Prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for any structure within this plat, the developer shall pay the parkland dedication fee, in the amount of \$107,357.78 to the City of Polk City. Per developer request, this fee shall be paid prior to issuance of a Building Permit for any structure in this plat.

RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL PLAT:

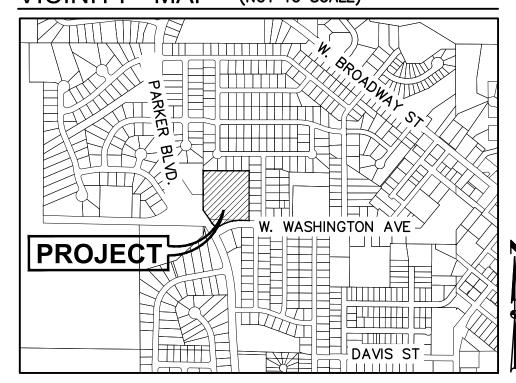

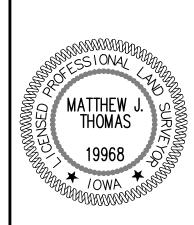

Subject: Budgeted Sanitary Sewer Jetting and Camera Work

BACKGROUND: It is time again to approve the annual jet cleaning of a portion of our sanitary sewer system. As you may recall, public works has a contractor jet clean approximately 1/5 of the sanitary sewer mains in our system annually. Each year we rotate to a different area of the system to try and keep all areas clean.

This year we budgeted \$40,000 for the jet cleaning process. We would propose to clean approximately 40,000 lineal feet of pipe for a total of \$36,000. Sometimes during the cleaning process, we find we may need to add some footage for more passes or just to get an area completed, so we would ask for a not to exceed amount of \$40,000.

This year four companies quoted the project with a range of \$0.90 per foot to \$1.40 per foot.

ALTERNATIVES: N/A

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: Not to exceed \$40,000.

RECOMMENDATION: I would recommend that the Council approve CIT Sewer Solutions quote of \$0.90 per foot not to exceed \$40,000.

Budgeted Water Treatment Plant Generator Replacement

BACKGROUND: Public Works has budgeted \$44,500 in the current budget to replace the electrical generator at the water treatment plant. If we have a power failure in the area, this generator runs the entire water treatment plant and well number #3. This generator is very important for the emergency operations of our water treatment facility, and we felt it was time to replace it due to the number of repairs we've made over the last couple of years.

Also included in this budget number was the relocation of the old generator from the water treatment plant to the public works facility. We feel that even though the generator has become non-dependable for something as important as the water treatment plant it could still have a use at our public works shop facility to run that entire complex. At this time, we are only asking for the water plant generator to be replaced and when we know what parts we can save, we will come back and get further council approval for the relocation of the existing generator to the shop.

We received two quotes for this replacement: one from Kohler Power Systems for \$36,213.14 and another from Interstate Power in the amount of \$35,750.00

ALTERNATIVES: None

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: \$35,750.00

RECOMMENDATION: Staff would recommend that Council approve the budgeted purchase of a replacement generator for the water treatment plant from Interstate Power in the amount of \$35,750.

BACKGROUND: Two years ago, we replaced the water treatment plant generator. Part of that plan was to relocate the old generator at the shop facility located at 301 E Northside Drive. In my memo to the council dated 8/09/2021 we said we would come back to council for approval when we knew exactly what was needed for the relocation and we now have that information.

We received three quotes for the final hookup of the generator at the maintenance facility ranging from \$21,300 to \$43,365. Par Industries was the lowest quote.

We also need an additional \$1200 for Midwest Critical Power LLC to do the generator startup.

BACKGROUND: It is time for our fall brush pile chipping and hauling away. We called three contractors that have completed the work in the past to quote the work needed to chip and remove the pile. One has returned a quote as asked. J. Pettiecord supplied us with a quote of \$44,500. We have used them at least three times and have done a good job for Polk City. This price is in line with past work that has been completed at the brush pile.

We have allocated \$60,000 for the pile to be chipped and removed two times in the current budget. This will be the first.

I feel that we need to make some changes to the brush pile policy and the recycling area to help bring the costs down for future years. Over the next couple of months, I will compile the information needed for a discussion and place it on a future work session agenda.

ALTERNATIVES: Alternatives will be brought back to a future work session.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: \$44,500

RECOMMENDATION: I recommend J. Pettiecord to complete the chipping and removal of the brush pile at the public works facility.

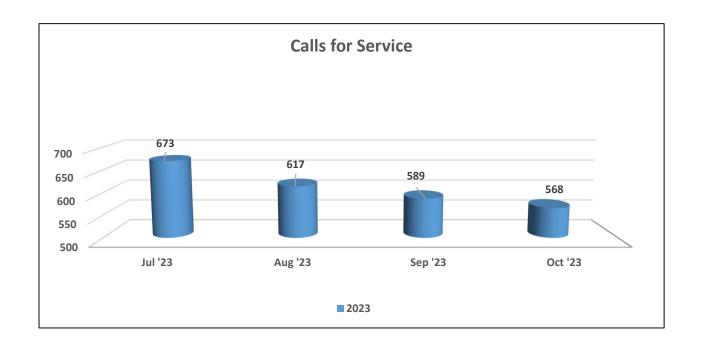

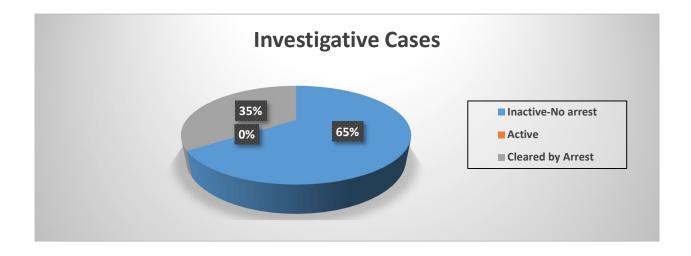
Calls for Service

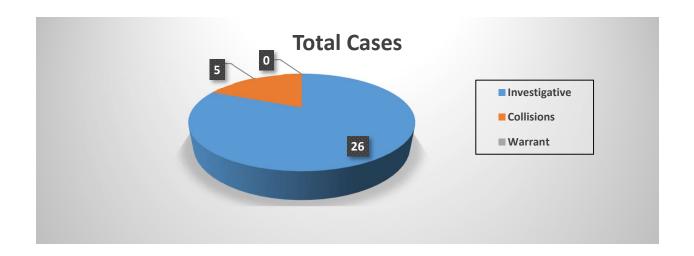

Cases Made

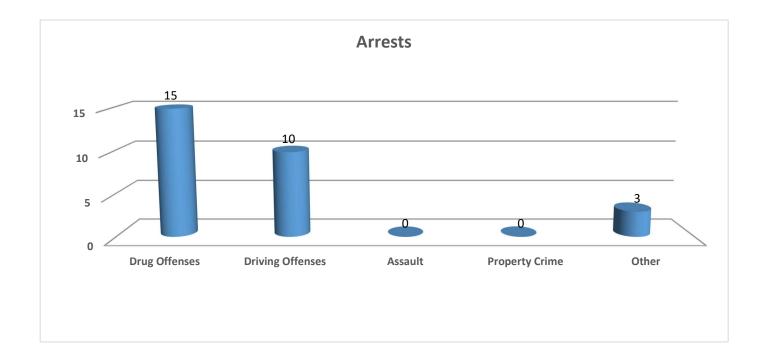
The Police Department had **31** total cases during the month of October. **26** of the cases were investigative incident reports and **5** were for vehicle collisions. There are no active investigations this month. There was a **35**% rate of cases cleared by arrest, for investigative cases in October.





Arrests Made

The Police Department made **28** arrests and issued **58** citations and **132** warnings. The arrests consisted of **10** driving related offenses, **15** drug related offenses, and **3** for miscellaneous offenses.



Notable Incidents

The driver was found to be intoxicated by alcohol, with an eventual breath specimen showing his breath alcohol level at .151%. 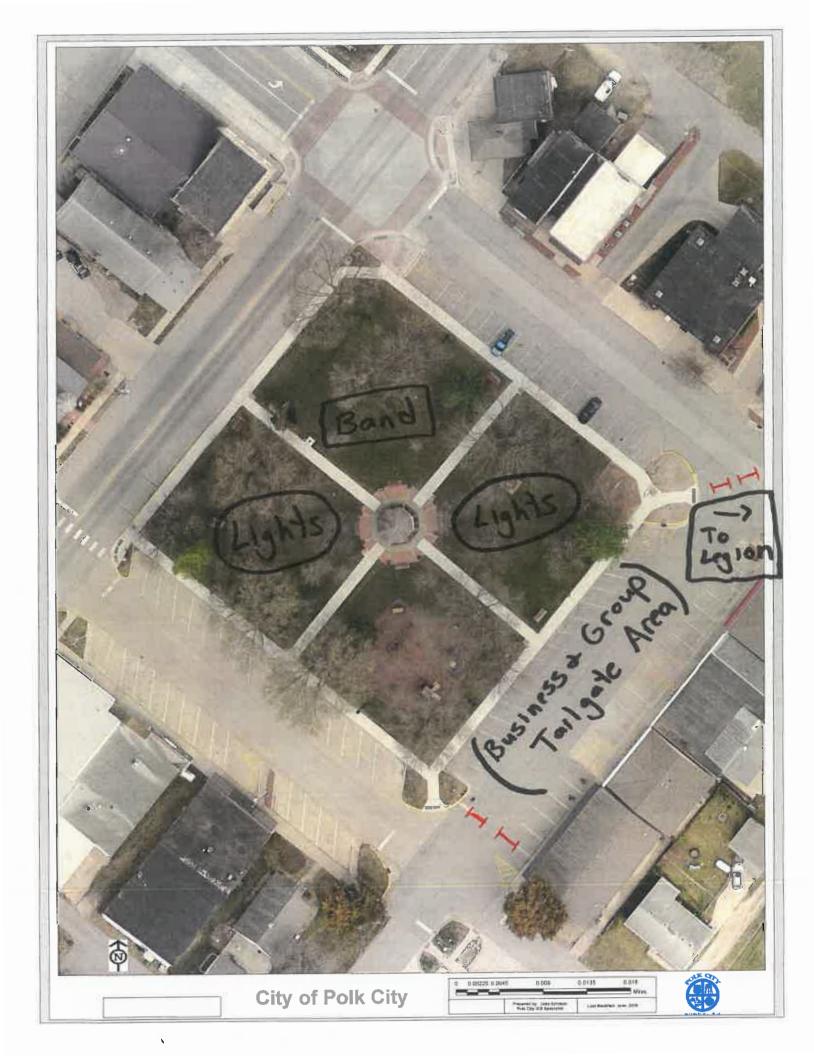

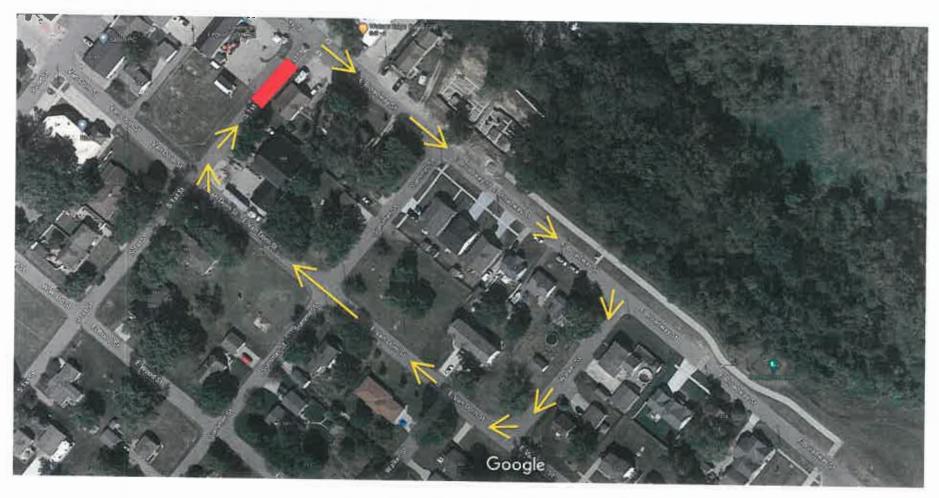

Subject: Set public hearing for FY24 budget amendment #1

BACKGROUND: On Monday, the City Council will set a public hearing for a budget amendment for the Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024). The proposed amendment includes amending for \$23,000 in revenue, and \$952,500 in expenditures. The largest line items that needs amended are for the purchase of property at 1600 W. Broadway Street and holding a special census. The city plans to use general fund reserves for the purchase of property. My recommendation for the special census is to use general fund reserves in FY24, and replenish those reserves with Local Option Sales Tax in FY2025.

Another significant expense is the addition of the Building Official to the city staff in September 2023. Although the budget will reflect additional expenses for this position in the amount of \$108,500, this change could provide for cost savings once the city begins conducting all building inspections in-house, instead of outsourcing them to a 3rd party. This change is estimated to occur January 1, 2024. Explanation for each adjustment is as follows:

Revenue:

- 1. Amend for RAGBRAI revenue in the amount of \$5,000
- 2. Amend for Police Forfeiture revenue in the amount of \$17,000

Expenses:

- 1. Amend for building department salary in the amount of \$65,000
- 2. Amend for building department overtime in the amount of \$2,500
- 3. Amend for Building Department FICA in the amount of \$6,000
- 4. Amend for Building Department IPERS in the amount of \$6,500
- 5. Amend for Building Department Group Insurance in the amount of \$20,000
- 6. Amend for Building Department Clothing allowance in the amount of \$500
- 7. Amend for Building Department vehicle allowance in the amount of \$4,000
- 8. Amend for Building Department subscriptions in the amount of \$500
- 9. Amend for Building Department training in the amount of \$1,000
- 10. Amend for Building Department travel and conference expenses in the amount of \$2,500
- 11. Amend for Ragbrai expenditures in the additional amount of \$5,000
- 12. Amend for property purchase for 1600 W. Broadway Street in the amount of \$420,000

- 13. Amend for a Special Census in the amount of \$402,000
- 14. Amend for police forfeiture expenditures in the amount of \$17,000

ALTERNATIVES: Do not set the public hearing for the proposed budget amendment

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The financial considerations for this amendment are additional expenditures in the amount of \$930,500. For the year ending, June 30, 2023, the City's General Fund will have a negative balance of -\$847,041 due to the property purchase and the special census, however, the City Council is using reserves for the purchase. I want to clarify that we are not spending more than we currently have available, the City does have very healthy general fund reserves, and we will spend some reserves, and replenish some of that availability next year with LOST funds.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council set the public hearing for budget amendment #1 for FY23-24 for Monday, December 11, 2023, at 6PM.

Explanation of Changes: The proposed amendment includes amending for \$23,000 in revenue, and \$952,500 in expenditures. The largest line items that needs amended are for the purchase of property at 1600 W. Broadway Street and holding a special census. The city plans to use general fund reserves for the purchase of property. My recommendation for the special census is to use general fund reserves in FY24, and replenish those reserves with Local Option

the purchase of property. My recommendation for the special census is to use general fund reserves in FY24, and replenish those reserves with Local Option Sales Tax in FY2025.

Another significant expense is the addition of the Building Official to the city staff in September 2023. Although the budget will reflect additional expenses for this position in the amount of \$108,500, this change could provide for cost savings once the city begins conducting all building inspections in-house, instead of outsourcing them to a 3rd party. This change is estimated to occur January 1, 2024. The financial considerations for this amendment are additional expenditures in the amount of \$930,500. For the year ending, June 30, 2023, the City's General Fund will have a negative balance of -\$847,041 due to the property purchase and the special census, however, the City Council is using reserves for the purchase. I want to clarify that we are not spending more than we currently have available, the City does have very healthy general fund reserves, and we will spend some reserves, and replenish some of that availability next year with LOST funds.

BACKGROUND: On Monday evening, the City Council will review a resolution indicating the City of Polk City's intent to participate in Central Iowa Water Works (CIWW). The City Council has authorized a previous resolution, but this intent to participate will represent another step in the process and ensures that Polk City is included in the final agreement establishing CIWW. There are several other steps the City Council will need to take, including approving the final 28E/28F agreement.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the resolution.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: There are no financial considerations regarding this resolution. There are financial considerations involved with CIWW, and we will be discussing those as we get closer to authorizing the agreement.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approve the resolution indicating intent to participate and authorizing the inclusion of Polk City in the final draft agreement for CIWW.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-137

Subject: Memorandum of Agreement with the United States Census Bureau for a Special Census

BACKGROUND: On Monday the City Council will review and consider approval of a memorandum of agreement for a special census. The City of Polk City's last official census count was 5,543. I am estimating a population of 6,770.

The special census target date is September 16, 2024, and the estimated cost for the special census is \$401,516. That payment will be due in February 2024, and the Census Bureau will track actual costs, which the city will be responsible for. I propose the City fund the special census with general fund reserves, and replenish those reserves with FY2025 Local Option Sales Tax.

The benefits of having a special census, and having a higher population is additional funding for both Road Use Tax and Local Option Sales Tax. Road Use Tax (RUT) is the easy projection for having a special census, and distributed state-wide. The City receives RUT dollars based upon per capita. For the current fiscal year, we receive \$130 per capita. That number increases each fiscal year, but with the estimated population for Polk City, I estimate that with RUT alone, the city would bring in an additional \$815,341.50 in RUT, which offsets the cost of the special census.

Local Option Sales Tax is a little bit more difficult to estimate, as only a portion of the formula (25%) is based on per capita. As other cities' populations in Polk County increase, the distribution for Polk City may not change very much. Therefore, for the purpose of the special census, I am estimating no increase to LOST because of these 2 circumstances. Polk City does typically have an increase in LOST from each fiscal year to the next, but I am not estimating for this purpose.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the special census agreement

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: \$401,516; this is an estimated cost, and the City will be responsible for actual costs which could be more or less than the estimate.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approve the memorandum of agreement with the United States Census Bureau.

Memorandum of Agreement Through Which **The City of Polk City, Iowa** Is Purchasing a Special Census From the U.S. Census Bureau

Agreement No. 0071-FY24-REI-21331-000

1) Parties and Scope

This document establishes an agreement between the **City of Polk City, Iowa** (Governmental Unit) and the Decennial Census Management Division, U.S. Census Bureau, through which the Governmental Unit will pay the Census Bureau to take a special census under the authority of 13 United States Code (U.S.C.) § 196.

2) Authority

The Census Bureau may undertake this work pursuant to 13 U.S.C. § 196, which provides that the "Secretary may conduct special censuses for the government of any State, or of any county, city, or other political subdivision within a State, for the government of the District of Columbia, and for the government of any possession or area (including political subdivisions thereof) referred to in Section 191(a) of this title, on subjects covered by the censuses provided for in this title, upon payment to the Secretary of the actual or estimated cost of each such special census. The results of each such special census shall be designated 'Official Census Statistics.' These statistics may be used in the manner provided by applicable law."

3) Cost Estimate

The Governmental Unit is responsible for all costs of taking the special census including, but not limited to, appropriately furnished office quarters, total compensation of all field enumeration and supervisory personnel, compensation of Census Bureau headquarters and regional office personnel for time allocated to the special census, overhead for headquarters and regional offices, processing and tabulation of data, and all other costs attributable to taking the special census. Based on the following factors the estimated cost for these services is \$401,516:

- Governmental Unit-provided estimated population of **6,800**,
- Governmental Unit -provided estimated housing unit count of **2,300**,
- and Governmental Unit -provided characteristics of the area(s) in which the special census will be conducted (including but not limited to geographic size, count of potential group quarters and transitory locations, and potential recent annexations).

A payment of that amount shall be furnished to the Census Bureau before any work on the special census is performed. The advance payment will be adjusted to actual costs and additional billing or refunds will be made as appropriate.

On a periodic basis, the parties will reconcile balances related to revenue and expenses for work performed under the agreement.

- a) The Census Bureau shall directly pay field representatives, field supervisors, and other temporary personnel hired locally to conduct the actual enumeration, at rates of pay fixed by the Census Bureau and based on the local area pay rates.
 - i) The Government Unit shall provide advance payment to the Census Bureau and/or United States for all funds to be expended by the Census Bureau resulting from payments to the Department of Labor under applicable federal workers' compensation and unemployment benefits laws.
- b) In addition to the salary expenses to be paid directly by the Census Bureau to all temporary employees hired locally, the Governmental Unit agrees to provide advance payment for all other expenses related to the taking of the special census, including but not limited to:
 - i) administrative and technical work performed by headquarters and regional personnel;
 - ii) printing and preparation of enumeration questionnaires and related materials;
 - iii) map preparation;
 - iv) tabulation expenses;
 - v) the cost of the designated Census Bureau employee's salary, allowances for subsistence at the standard federal rate per day, traveling expenses, other reasonable and necessary expenses, overhead, and other charges applicable to these costs; and
 - vi) other incidental expenses incurred by the Census Bureau in completing the special census.

In accordance with (3)(b) if actual cost exceeds the advance payment, the additional payment to the Census Bureau is due in full, 30 days from the date of the invoice.

4) Terms and Conditions

Acknowledging the foregoing, the parties agree as follows:

- a) The Census Bureau will receive reimbursement for all identifiable costs for the goods and services it is providing under this agreement:
 - i) The Census Bureau employee(s) shall oversee all aspects of the enumeration including the hiring, training, and separation of field representatives, field supervisors, and other temporary personnel employed locally to take the special census. The designated Census Bureau employee(s) shall exercise day-to-day technical supervision of these employees. All such temporary personnel shall be Federal Government employees and neither the Governmental Unit nor any representative of the Governmental Unit shall supervise, exercise control over, or in any other way interfere with such employees in the performance of their responsibilities.

- ii) The Governmental Unit shall update maps of the proposed special census area in accordance with instructions provided by the Census Bureau. The Governmental Unit shall provide any certification of legal boundaries within the proposed special census area as required by the Census Bureau. Once the Governmental Unit boundaries have been certified by the Census Bureau, these boundaries will become the official boundaries for the special census. Additionally, any annexations after the Governmental Unit has certified its boundaries will not be included in the special census. The special census will not be scheduled until these obligations have been completed to the satisfaction of the Census Bureau.
- iii) The Census Bureau shall provide to the Governmental Unit the official population and housing unit count derived from the special census at the earliest practicable date after completion of the enumeration and the processing required to produce the statistical results, including but not limited to disclosure avoidance review (see Section 6). This count, which shall be as of the special census reference date (tentatively scheduled for **September 16, 2024**), will be provided in writing and signed by an appropriate Census Bureau official.
- iv) The Census Bureau will not guarantee delivery of the final count by any specified date and shall not be held responsible for any loss or damages suffered by the Governmental Unit due to the data not being available by a specific date.
- b) The Governmental Unit accepts that responses to a special census, unlike a decennial census, are voluntary and some respondents may choose to not answer some questions. When this happens, the Census Bureau will make every effort to collect as much information as possible. If the Census Bureau cannot obtain information directly from respondents, the Census Bureau will follow statistical procedures to assign the missing information based on information provided by people in the housing unit or from people from neighboring housing units.

The Governmental Unit also accepts that, to complete the count of the group quarters population, it may be necessary for the Census Bureau to obtain information for people residing in certain institutions (such as correctional facilities with security issues) from administrative records rather than from the respondents themselves. The Census Bureau will provide detailed statistical results to the Governmental Unit subject to limitations imposed by Title 13 United States Code to protect the confidentiality of respondents.

Further, the Governmental Units accepts that Domestic Violence Shelters are out of scope for the special census and will not be included in any special census enumeration.

- c) The Census Bureau can only use the special census counts in the intercensal population estimates program if:
 - i.) the entire area of a governmental unit is included in the special census, and

- ii.) the legal boundaries of the governmental unit correspond to those used in the Population Estimates program (boundaries legally in effect on January 1 of the estimates year), and
- iii.) the boundaries are reported to the Census Bureau for processing by March 1 of the estimates year, and
- iv.) final approved counts from the special census enumeration are ready by August 1 of the estimates year.

If a Governmental Unit requests a partial special census, they do so with the understanding that the results of this partial special census will not be included in any subsequent Census Bureau population estimates.

d) A Governmental Unit can request a special census for the entire area encompassed by that Governmental Unit, known as a full special census, or for only a portion of their area, known as a partial special census. A partial special census is conducted using the same methodologies and procedures as a full special census, but it is for a subset of areas within the jurisdiction of the local Governmental Unit. The areas requested in a partial special census must contain at least one full census tract that is completely within the jurisdiction of the Governmental Unit and can contain additional contiguous tracts or census blocks that are within the jurisdiction of the Governmental Unit.

In addition to impacting cost, the geography included in the special census may impact which data products the Governmental Units receive based on disclosure avoidance considerations. Regardless of the scope of the special census, the Governmental Unit will receive a letter from the director of the U.S. Census Bureau and a block-level special census data product that contains total population and total housing unit counts for the Governmental Unit. An additional data product may include a demographic profile for the entire governmental unit or whole tracts contained within the special census area. However, some Governmental Units may not receive the demographic profile based on the geography for which the special census is conducted. For those impacted Governmental Units, the Census Bureau will define the allowable data products that the Governmental Unit will receive prior to signing the MOA.

The Governmental Unit shall accept as final the official population count and other statistical results when provided by the Census Bureau.

- e) Upon request, the Governmental Unit shall supply free of charge satisfactory office space, other equipment, and furnishings as determined necessary and proper by the Census Bureau. This information will be included in an initial letter from the Regional Director to the Governmental Unit. These quarters must meet all security and confidentiality requirements as agreed to by the Census Bureau representative.
- f) In taking the special census, the Census Bureau is directly responsible for compensating all field personnel determined necessary by the Census Bureau for taking the special

census. The Census Bureau shall hire sufficiently qualified applicants for field representatives, field supervisors, and other positions as may be needed to complete the special census. Employees shall be selected for employment and separated under standards established by the Census Bureau, and shall take an oath or affirmation, as required, to protect the confidentiality of the information they collect. The Census Bureau shall be responsible for all administrative operations relating to the reconcilement and payment of these employees.

Such field personnel shall be and remain employees of the Census Bureau, subject to all applicable federal, state, and local laws, including but not limited to those pertaining to the Equal Employment Opportunity Act and the Fair Labor Standards Act applicable to these employees, and shall complete and file any and all reports required thereunder.

- g) The Governmental Unit is responsible for promoting the special census through locally-based targeted outreach efforts. This promotion may inform people about the special census, encourage people to apply to recruiting efforts, and/or encourage people living in the applicable area to respond.
- h) All temporary staff hired to conduct the special census, including but not limited to field representatives and field supervisors, are employees of the Federal Government. Therefore, regarding the negligent or wrongful acts of any temporary employees arising from their employment pursuant to this MOA, any claims and/or litigation arising from said acts will be adjudicated pursuant to the Federal Tort Claims Act, 28 U.S.C. 2671 et seq. (see section (3)(a)(ii) herein regarding reimbursement and indemnification requirements).
- i) The Census Bureau has a policy of publicly disclosing the identity of governmental units which have signed MOAs requesting and paying for a special census, and signature of this MOA constitutes agreement of the parties to this Census Bureau policy.

5) Confidentiality

The data, including individual information collected by the enumerators on the special census questionnaires, collected under this agreement are confidential under 13 U.S.C. § 9. All such special census questionnaires and all other papers relating to the special census are the property of the Census Bureau and under the law may only be made available to and examined by sworn Census Bureau officials and employees. Unlawful disclosure subjects Census Bureau employees to a fine of up to \$250,000 or imprisonment of up to 5 years, or both.

Should the Governmental Unit require access to Title 13 data to assist in the planning, data collection, data analysis, or production of final products, those staff members are required to obtain Census Bureau Special Sworn Status pursuant to 13 U.S.C. § 23(c). Such staff members must demonstrate that they have suitable background clearance, and they must take Title 13 awareness training. Any access to Title 13 data at the Governmental Unit's facility is subject to prior approval by the Census Bureau's Data Stewardship Executive Policy

Committee upon assurance that the facility security and information technology security meet Census Bureau requirements.

6) Disclosure Avoidance Review of Statistical Products

Title 13, Section 9 of the U.S.C. requires the Census Bureau to keep confidential the information collected from the public under the authority of Title 13. Section 214 of Title 13, U.S.C., and Sections 3551, 3559 and 3571 of Title 18, U.S.C., provide for the imposition of penalties of up to five years in prison and/or up to \$250,000.00 in fines for wrongful disclosure of confidential Census information.

Disclosure avoidance is the process for protecting the confidentiality of data, as required under Title 13 U.S.C. A disclosure of data occurs when someone can use published statistical information to identify an individual who has provided confidential information. For data tabulations, the Census Bureau uses disclosure avoidance procedures to modify or remove the characteristics that put confidential information at risk for disclosure. Although a published table may appear to show information about a specific individual, the Census Bureau has taken steps to disguise or suppress the original data, while making sure the results are still useful. The techniques used by the Census Bureau to protect confidentiality in tabulations vary, depending on the type of data.

Noise injection is the Census Bureau's preferred disclosure avoidance technique. By policy, noise injection is to be applied to all data products that are reported at geographic areas with small populations (GASP). For the purposes of this guidance, a GASP is a population that is smaller than the smallest population of any congressional district.

In cases when it is not feasible to fully implement noise injection within the period of the contract, a transition plan for implementing noise injection or other provable privacy methods must be developed in coordination with the Census Bureau. Noise injection may be required for microdata releases, depending on the characteristics of the microdata and the specific variables that are to be released. Data that cannot be publicly released may still be analyzed within the Federal Statistical Research Data Centers (FSRDCs) by individuals who have Special Sworn Status (SSS); the results of such analyses must still go through a disclosure avoidance process prior to being publicly released.

The parties understand that Title 13 confidentiality protection and disclosure avoidance techniques apply to all work described in this agreement. The disclosure avoidance methods are defined by the Census Bureau who has the responsibility of carrying out that work. Accordingly, upon completion of the tabulation, the data produced must be reviewed by the Census Bureau to ensure that no identifiable Title 13 data are or may be disclosed.

Should the Census Bureau's Disclosure Review Board (DRB) determine that the requested statistical product does or reasonably could result in such disclosure, then the data product will be modified prior to approval for release to the party(ies) of this agreement. The DRB must approve before a research product can be released to an individual who does not have SSS and a

need to know or moved to a computer not approved for controlled data according to the Census Bureau's existing policies and procedures.

The parties agree that if there is a change regarding the information in this section, the party making the change will notify the other party in writing of such change.

8) Duration of Agreement, Amendments, and Modifications

This agreement will become effective when signed by all parties. The agreement will terminate on **September 16, 2025**, but may be amended at any time by mutual consent of the parties. Any party may terminate this agreement by providing **30** days' written notice to the other party. This agreement is subject to the availability of funds.

9) Resolution of Disagreements

Should a disagreement arise on the interpretation of the provisions of this agreement, or amendments, and/or revisions thereto, that cannot be resolved at the operating level, the area(s) of disagreement shall be stated in writing by each party and presented to the other party for consideration. If agreement on interpretation is not reached within thirty days, the parties shall forward the written presentation of the disagreement to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution.

10) Termination Cost

If the **City of Polk City, Iowa** cancels the order, the Census Bureau is authorized to collect costs incurred prior to cancellation of the order plus any termination costs, up to the total payment amount provided for under this agreement.

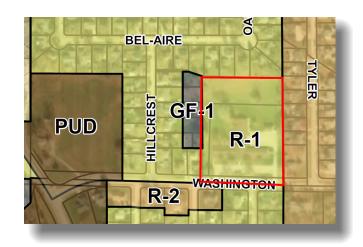
Subject Property: On With Life parcels Project No.: 123.1107.01

BACKGROUND:

The Site Plan for On With Life was approved by City Council on April 24, 2023 for renovation of the vacant Polk City Nursing Home and Rehabilitation Center into an in-patient skilled nursing facility for individuals who have experienced a brain injury and require long-term care. At this time, this 3.4-acre site continues to be a long-standing non-conforming use of this property per the R-1 zoning

district regulations. On With Life, Inc. is in the process of purchasing the vacant 1.68-acre L-shaped parcel on the north and west side of their 3.4-acre original property to enhance their facility.

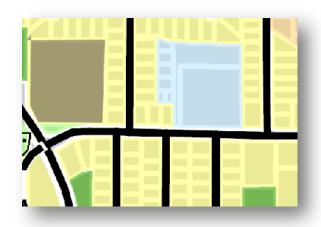
The applicant has submitted a signed *Petition to Rezone* both of their properties, outlined in red on the Zoning Map to the right, from R-1 Single Family Detached Residential to R-3 Multiple Family Residential (Restricted), along with abutting ½ ROW for W. Washington Avenue. Current adjacent zoning includes R-1, R-2 and GF-1. The proposed rezoning would bring their facility into compliance with the Zoning Regulations.



Owners of 50.01% of the 250' buffer surrounding the proposed zoning boundary have consented to the proposed rezoning. The date of the public hearing for this this rezoning will be set after P&Z forwards their recommendation to City Council.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The 2016 Comprehensive Plan designated the nursing home, the abutting L-shaped parcel, and the abutting GG-1 for civic use which is compatible with the in-patient care facility on the subject properties. As a result, there is no need for an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan unless P&Z prefers this area to be designated for high-density residential use. If so, a public hearing for the amendment to the Comprehensive Plan will be scheduled along with City Council's public hearing on the proposed rezoning.



REVIEW COMMENTS:

All staff review comments have been addressed.

RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE PROPOSED REZONING:

On September 18, 2023, the Planning & Zoning Commission recommended Council approval of the applicant's request to rezone their property to R-3 Multiple Family Residential. Further, Planning & Zoning recommended that City Council approve restrictions for the parcel, limiting the permitted uses of these parcels to be Nursing Homes, Assisted Care Facilities, Independent Care Facilities, and Group Homes. The property owner agreed to these restrictions via email to City Staff on September 14, 2023.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-8100

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 115, CABLE TELEVISION REGULATIONS

Section 1. Chapter 115, Cable Television Regulations, Section 115.12, Installation and Maintenance of Property of the Grantee, is hereby amended by adopting the underlined language:

115.12 INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF PROPERTY OF THE GRANTEE. During the term of the franchise, the property of the Grantee shall be constructed, operated, maintained, repaired, replaced, renewed, reconstructed, and removed in accordance with generally accepted engineering principles so as not to endanger or interfere with the lives of persons or to interfere with improvements which the City may deem proper to make or to unnecessarily hinder or obstruct pedestrian or vehicular traffic or use of public property or private property. Grantee shall install utility vaults rather than pedistals in all instances where such installation is possible.

- **Section 3.** All Ordinances or parts of any Ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
- **Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
