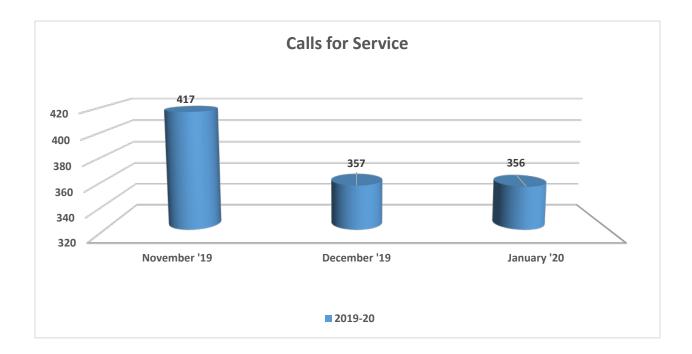

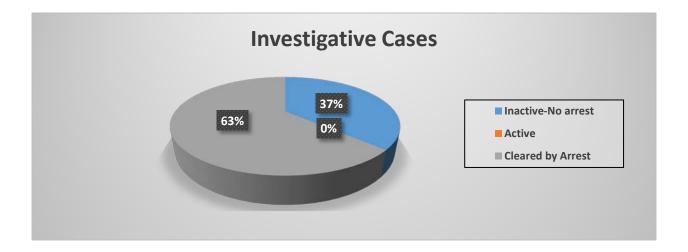
Calls for Service

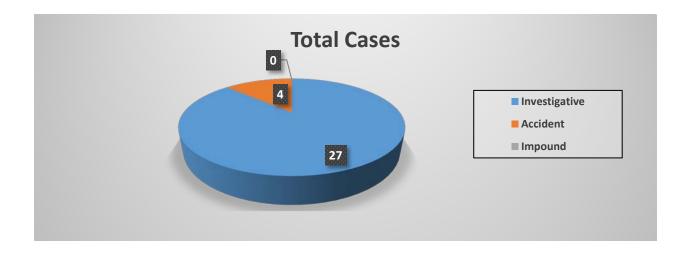

Cases Made

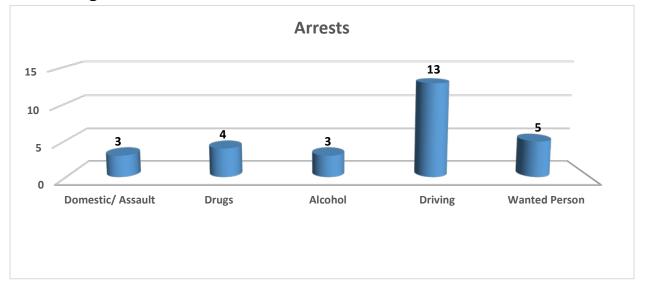
The Police Department had **31** total cases during the month of January. **27** of the cases were investigative incident reports and **4** were traffic crashes. There are no active investigations from this month. There was a **63%** rate of cases cleared by arrest, for investigative cases in January.





Arrests Made

The Police Department made **28** arrests and issued **17** citations and **59** warnings. Among those arrests, were **13** driving offenses, **5** wanted subjects, **3** domestic assault, **3** were alcohol related offenses and **4** were drug related offenses.



Notable Incidents

On January 20th at approximately 6:30 pm, a Polk City Police Officer responded to a domestic disturbance at 317 E. Wood Street. The suspect, a Des Moines resident, had reportedly assaulted the mother of his children and fled the scene in his vehicle. The officer located the suspect driving away from the scene and initiated a traffic stop. The suspect was found to be in possession of a loaded handgun and a glass methamphetamine pipe. An investigation revealed that the suspect had grabbed the victim by the throat and ears causing injury to the victim. The suspect was charged with Domestic Abuse Assault Causing Bodily Injury, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Driving While License Suspended. At the time of the stop, the suspect had a concealed weapons permit; therefore no charges related to the possession of the handgun were filed. On January 21st at approximately 3:00 am, a Polk City Police Officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle occupied by 2 Ankeny residents. An investigation resulted in the seizure of over 2 ounces of marijuana of which the passenger admitted ownership. The passenger was charged with Possession with Intent to Deliver Marijuana and Failure to Affix Drug Tax Stamp. The driver was charged with Driving While License Suspended.

On January 21st at approximately 4:30 pm, a Polk City Police Officer was dispatched to 404 Crestmoor Place for a report of a domestic disturbance. An investigation revealed that the suspect, who is an adult male, had struck his mother causing a laceration to her head. The suspect was charged with Domestic Abuse Assault Causing Bodily Injury.

On January 10th, an arrest warrant was requested for a Polk City resident for a charge of Domestic Abuse Assault- Impeding Airway, stemming from an incident that occurred in November. On January 23rd, a Polk City Officer observed the suspect driving and conducted a traffic stop. The suspect was arrested on the outstanding warrant and was additionally charged with Driving While License Revoked.

Officer Aicher and Eudoris were deployed 4 times in January. Two deployments were for narcotics, one for a burglary alarm at a local business, and one as an assist on a high-risk traffic stop.

On January 4th at approximately 2:45 am, Officer Aicher heard radio traffic that a Boone County Deputy was involved in a vehicle pursuit which was coming towards Polk City. The vehicle was occupied by two suspects from Story County. Officer Aicher positioned himself in an area to assist the Deputy. The pursuit entered Polk City, where the suspects turned into the driveway of the TCI maintenance building and stopped upon realizing it was a dead-end. Officer Aicher deployed K9 Eudoris to assist the Boone County Deputy in taking these suspects into custody. The driver was found to have felony parole violation warrants and also had a suspended driver's license. The passenger was on probation for felony drug charges. A search of the vehicle revealed drugs and drug paraphernalia. The Boone County Deputy also reported that the suspects had been throwing things out of the car during the pursuit.

On January 20th at approximately 1:00 am, Officer Aicher responded to assist a Polk County Deputy on NW Sheldahl drive on a report of a subject who drove his vehicle into a pasture. Upon contact with the suspect, the officers determined the suspect was high on narcotics. The suspect was detained and K9 Eudoris was deployed on the vehicle. Eudoris alerted on the vehicle and as a result, marijuana residue and hypodermic needles were found in the vehicle. The suspect was taken to a medical facility for evaluation and the Polk County Deputy conducted an investigation into Operating While Intoxicated (drug related).

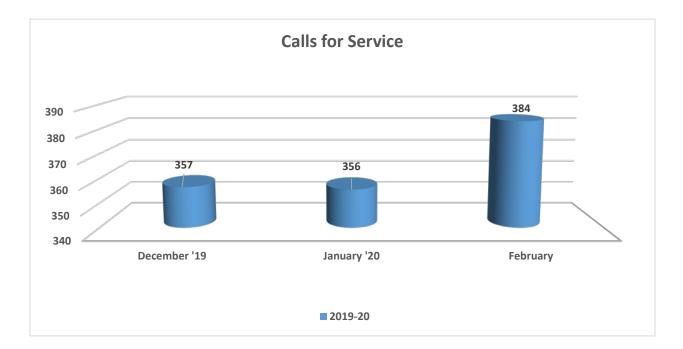

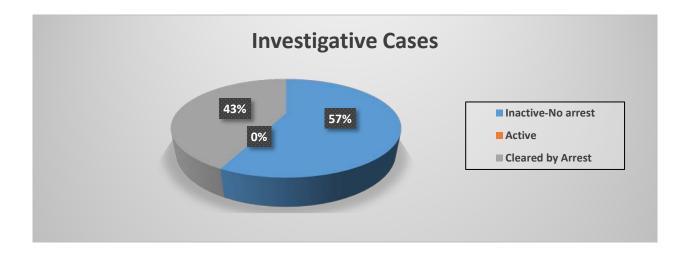

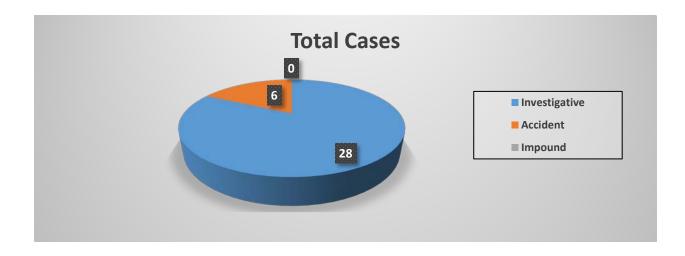

Cases Made

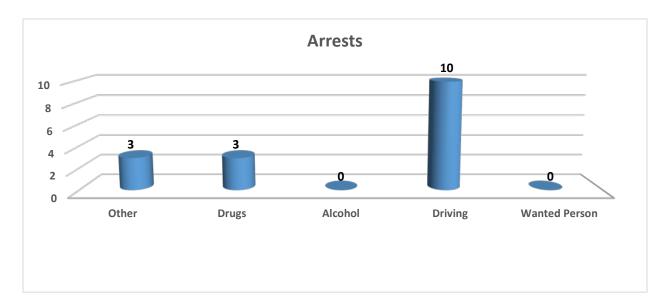

Arrests Made

The Police Department made **16** arrests and issued **37** citations and **73** warnings. Among those arrests, there were **10** driving offenses, **3** were for drug related offenses, and **3** were for miscellaneous offenses.



Notable Incidents

On February 6, 2020 at approximately 12:20 pm, a Polk City Police Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding. While speaking with the driver, the officer noticed a marijuana smoking pipe in plain view. Further investigation lead to the discovery of over 28 grams of marijuana. The suspect was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. On February 23, 2020 at approximately 3:35 am, a Polk City resident flagged down a Polk City Police Officer to report a suspicious vehicle. The citizen reported that they had seen a silver Chevy Tahoe in a residential neighborhood that was occupied and had heavy front end damage. The citizen was concerned that the driver may have hit something. The officer located the vehicle traveling eastbound on NW 118th Avenue and initiated a traffic stop after observing the vehicle swerving. Upon contact with the driver, the officer determined that the driver may be impaired. Upon ordering him to exit the vehicle, the driver refused to comply and fled in his vehicle. A vehicle pursuit ensued and went into Ankeny. The driver fled from the vehicle on foot, but after a search of the area the suspect was located and apprehended with the assistance of Ankeny Officers and their K9. An unknown type of drugs and a crack cocaine pipe were located on the route on which the suspect fled. A search warrant was executed to obtain a blood specimen from the suspect. The suspect was charged with Operating While Intoxicated (drug related), Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Interference w/ Official Acts Causing Bodily Injury, and Eluding. He was additionally cited for numerous traffic violations. An additional charge for Possession of a Controlled Substance is pending lab results. The suspect is on parole with the lowa Department of Corrections and as a result of this incident it was determined that he violated the conditions of his parole. In addition to the local charges, he is being held on a Parole Violation warrant issued by the Iowa Department of Corrections.

In Service Training

The Polk City Police Department conducted in-service training on conducting 2 officer contacts with one or more subjects.

Individual Officer Training

Lt. Aswegan attended training on obtaining search warrants to retrieve a bodily specimen from suspects of impaired driving when involved in collisions. The training was administered by the Iowa Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau. This is part of on-going training that Lt. Aswegan attends as the department's Drug Recognition Expert.

BACKGROUND: On January 14, 2020 The Polk City Police Department began a hiring process to fill the fulltime officer vacancy. This process consisted of a physical fitness test, panel interview, POST written test, and a Chief's interview. Upon completion of the process, Alex Delaney was selected to fill fulltime officer position. Mr. Delaney will begin his training with the Polk City Police Department on March 24, 2020 and will be attending the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy beginning April 27, 2020.

ALTERNATIVES: N/A

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: Mr. Delaney is not a certified Peace Officer and his starting annual wage will be on step 00 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement set at \$23.73/hour (\$49,346.17).

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approves Alex Delaney's hiring at a pay rate of \$23.73/hour.

BACKGROUND: The new full-time officer, Alex Delaney, will be attending the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy. During this time the city will be paying his wages and will be paying academy fees that include a meal plan during his attendance. It is common practice for departments to require non-certified hires to sign a Training Reimbursement Agreement for training costs and wages associated with the hiring and certifying a new officer.

ALTERNATIVES: We do not require that he sign a Training Reimbursement Agreement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The City of Polk City will be investing over \$20,000 in wages and training costs to certify a new officer. A Training Reimbursement Agreement will require that the officer reimburse the city for those costs should they voluntarily resign from the city, are dismissed during probationary period, or they fail to complete required training. The reimbursement schedule is outlined in section 7 of the Training Reimbursement Agreement that you were provided with.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approves the Training Reimbursement Agreement as drafted for Alex Delaney.

Polk City Police Training Reimbursement Agreement

AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into by the City of Polk City, Iowa ("City") and Alex Delaney, ("Probationary Candidate") on the 23 day of March, 2020.

The intent of this agreement is to provide for the training of Probationary Candidate as a Police Officer, and to specify the consideration that Probationary Candidate provide the City in return for the training. It shall not be construed in any way as an employment agreement.

- 1. **Training.** The City and Probationary Candidate agree that Probationary Candidate will attend the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy ("Academy") and complete all training in accordance with the Academy's and City's training requirements. The training at the Academy is scheduled to begin April 27, 2020. The City shall pay Probationary Candidate's "Total Training Expenses" as defined in this Agreement, provided that Probationary Candidate shall be required to document by signed and dated attendance sheets all time spent in training sessions or training related activities. Probationary Candidate shall be required to submit any attendance sheets and claim forms to the City within twenty (20) days of any time worked or expenses incurred by Probationary Candidate.
- 2. **Work Required.** Probationary Candidate may, at City's option, be required to serve as Police Officer for the City while attending the training program, as well as perform other duties as assigned by the Police Chief or the Chief's designee. The hours expended by Probationary Candidate in attendance at the training course and service to the Police department shall be subject to the same limitations as outlined in this document.
- 3. **Probationary Period.** Probationary Candidate shall have a probationary period of twelve (12) months.
- 4. **Post Training Work.** Probationary Candidate shall serve as a Police Officer of the City after graduation from the Academy and after meeting all criteria to receive proper certifications.
- 5. **Work Duration Required.** In consideration of the City's payment of Probationary Candidate "Total Training Expenses" as hereafter defined, Probationary Candidate agrees to be a Police Officer for the City for a period of at least four (4) years from the date when Probationary Candidate graduates from the Academy and has met all criteria needed to receive certifications.
- 6. **Failure to Complete Training Reimbursement.** In the event Probationary Candidate does not successfully complete the training program, Probationary Candidate shall be released from the City Police Department, and Probationary Candidate shall reimburse the City the "Total Training Expenses" that the City incurred in accordance with the terms set forth.
- 7. **Voluntary Resignation Reimbursement.** In the event Probationary Candidate voluntarily resigns from the City Police Department without having served as a Police Officer for at least forty-eight (48) full months but has otherwise complied with the terms of this agreement, Probationary Candidate shall reimburse the City for the Total Training Expenses incurred per the following schedule:
 - a. The amount of reimbursement shall be determined as follows:
 - i. If a Probationary Candidate resigns less than twelve (12) full months following completion of approved training, Probationary Candidate will owe the City one hundred percent (100%) of the Total Training Expenses;
 - ii. If a Probationary Candidate resigns after twelve (12) full months but fewer than twenty-four (24) full months after completion of approved training, Probationary

Candidate will owe the City seventy-five percent (75%) of the Total Training Expenses;

- iii. If a Probationary Candidate resigns after twenty-four (24) full months but fewer than thirty-six (36) full months after completion of the approved training, Probationary Candidate will owe the City fifty percent (50%) of the Total Training Expenses;
- iv. If a Probationary Candidate resigns after thirty-six (36) full months but fewer than forty-eight (48) full months after completion of the approved training, Probationary Candidate will owe the City twenty-five percent (25%) of the Total Training Expenses; and
- v. If a Probationary Candidate resigns after forty-eight (48) full months after completion of the approved training, Probationary Candidate will owe the City zero percent (0%) of the Total Training Expenses.
- 8. **Dismissal Reimbursement.** If Probationary Candidate is dismissed during the probationary period; is dismissed before serving as a Police Officer for at least thirty-six (36) full months; or otherwise fails to comply with the terms of this Agreement, Probationary Candidate shall reimburse the City for one hundred percent (100%) of the Total Training Expenses incurred.
- 9. **Reduction in Force Reimbursement.** If Probationary Candidate is dismissed due to a reduction in force by the City, Probationary Candidate shall not be required to reimburse the City for any of the Total Training Expenses.
- 10. **Completion of Required Service.** If Probationary Candidate completes forty-eight (48) months of service with the City as a Police Officer after graduation from Academy, Probationary Candidate shall be relieved of all obligations to reimburse the City for training expenses under this Agreement.

Total Training Expenses. An estimate of the costs of the "Total Training Expenses" as of 2020 is eight thousand five hundred fifty dollars (\$8,550) plus wages. However, "Total Training Expenses" will be based on the actual cost incurred by the City—except that Probationary Candidate will not be responsible for reimbursing the City for any wages paid to Probationary Candidate for performing non-training work or other work assigned by the City. Probationary candidate agrees that the following enumerated expenses that are incurred by the City, or that are incurred by Probationary Candidate and reimbursed by the City shall constitute the "Total Training Expenses" subject to Employee reimbursement under this Agreement:

- a. The City's costs and expenses, including Probationary Candidate's salary, incurred while Probationary Candidate attends the Academy;
- b. The City's costs and expenses for tuition and fees paid to the educational facility utilized for training;
- c. The City's expenses of paying or reimbursing Probationary Candidate's clothing vendor costs and uniform/equipment costs; and/or
- d. Any other unexpected costs and expenses the City may incur as a result of Probationary Candidate's training.
- 11. **Limitation of Reimbursement Obligation.** Probationary Candidate and City agree that this Agreement is subject to applicable provisions of state and federal law.
- 12. **Repayment of Expenses.** Unless otherwise agreed upon in writing between the City and Probationary Candidate, any amount due by Probationary Candidate pursuant to this Agreement shall be paid in full within thirty (30) days of voluntary resignation or termination of Probationary Candidate. Failure to make such a payment in full within thirty (30) days, may result in the City taking any legal action as allowed by law against Probationary Candidate.

- 13. **Death of Probationary Candidate.** If Probationary Candidate is killed or permanently and totally disabled as defined by the Iowa Code—or dies of any cause not related to Probationary Candidate's work for the City—Probationary Candidate and/or his/her estate shall be relieved of all obligation to reimburse the City under this Agreement.
- 14. **Amendment or Cancellation.** This agreement may be amended or canceled only upon written agreement of both the City and Probationary Candidate signed by both parties.
- 15. **Residence.** Probationary Candidate shall notify the City of Probationary Candidate's place of residence while in the employment of the City and/or until such time as the Total Training Expenses are paid and satisfied in full.
- 16. **DHS.** If reimbursement is not made in accordance with this Agreement, Probationary Candidate understands that the City may at its option send delinquent account to be recovered through the Iowa Income Offset Program, (State DHS).
- 17. **Contest.** To contest any adverse employment action, which triggers the reimbursement obligation, or to contest the required reimbursement amount calculated by the City, Probationary Candidate agrees to initiate any such proceedings within thirty (30) days of the City's demand for reimbursement.
- 18. **Purpose of Agreement.** This agreement is for the purpose of Probationary Candidate's bona fide service as a Police Officer and not for the purpose of achieving certification for Probationary Candidate by the way of "sponsorship" through the Academy.
- 19. **Severability.** In the event that one or more of the provisions of the Agreement shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect the remaining provisions of the Agreement, and they shall remain in full force and effect.

Subject: Vehicle lease agreement

BACKGROUND:

The 2015 Dodge Charge we currently have in our patrol rotation is expected to exceed 90,000 miles before July 1, 2020 and needs to be replaced. This vehicle would be rotated to a back-up patrol vehicle to be utilized when out front-line vehicles are down for maintenance. The 2012 Ford Taurus that is currently our back-up patrol vehicle, is not operational in a patrol capacity. This vehicle will either sold through an on-line governmental auction program or be traded in towards the new vehicle.

Two years ago the Police Department began to lease patrol vehicles and equipment in order to streamline the upfitting and purchase of vehicles as they are needing replaced.

We previously have been utilizing Keltek Inc. out of Baxter, IA. I have re-evaluated the costs associated with utilizing Keltek Inc. as a leasing vendor and determined the city would save a considerable amount of money by leasing patrol vehicles through RUAN and have the vehicles upfitted through Karl Chevrolet. RUAN can provide vehicles at state-bid pricing and words directly with any upfitting company of our choice (in this case Karl Chevrolet).

Keltek Inc. is the state bid holder for the Panasonic equipment we utilize in the vehicles and they contract with Karl Chevrolet so we would maintain a working relationship with Keltek in regard to our vehicle equipment. This new lease is for a Chevrolet Silverado that would be put into the patrol rotation. At the end of the lease the city can purchase the vehicle for \$1 and maintain it as a back-up patrol vehicle or trade it in towards the replacement vehicle.

ALTERNATIVES: N/A

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The 48-month lease provided by RUAN contains quotes for the vehicle, upfitting, Panasonic equipment, and radio. The total amount would be \$62,120.64. I plan to spread these payments annually at \$15,530.16 with a residual value of \$1. Our Current lease agreement with Keltek (which includes their service agreement) is \$68,936.60 with a residual value of \$26,368.70. A cost savings of \$33,184.66. Adding a new vehicle lease agreement is in the budget FY21.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approves the lease agreement with RUAN for the 2020 Chevrolet Silverado patrol vehicle.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020-28

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH RUAN FOR A VEHICLE, HARDWARE AND EQUIPMENT FOR A PATROL VEHICLE

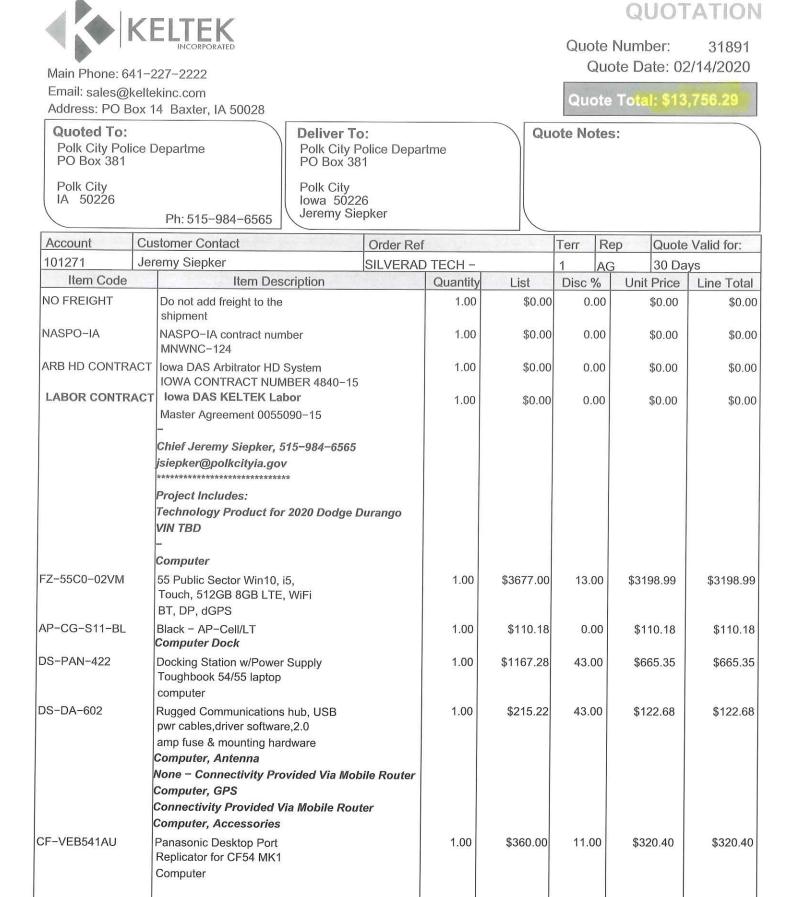

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 9, adopted November 7, 2017, the Board of Supervisors of Polk County, Iowa (the "County") found and determined that certain areas located within the County are eligible and should be designated as an urban renewal area under Iowa law, and approved and adopted the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Plan (the "Urban Renewal Plan" or "Plan") for the Whitetail Ridge Residential Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area" or "Area") described therein, which Plan as amended, is on file in the office of the Recorder of Polk County; and

WHEREAS, the Plan has been amended by Amendment No. 1 in 2019, and is proposed to be further amended by an Amendment No. 2, planned for the Polk County Board of Supervisor's consideration on April 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that properties within the Area be redeveloped as part of the overall redevelopment area covered by said Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a proposal from Polk County, Iowa and MJR Developments, L.L.C. (the "Developer"), in the form of a proposed Development Agreement (the "Agreement") by and between the City, the County, and the Developer, pursuant to which, among other things, the Developer would agree to construct certain Minimum Improvements and Public Improvements (as those terms are defined in the Agreement) on certain real property located within the Urban Renewal Area as defined and legally described in the Agreement ("Development Property") and consisting of the construction of a phase of a single-family housing project including approximately 30 Housing Units, together with all related site improvements for the Big Creek Valley Subdivision Plat 2, as outlined in the proposed Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement further proposes that the County will make up to twenty (20) consecutive semi-annual payments of Economic Development Grants to Developer consisting of 58.88% of the Tax Increments pursuant to Iowa Code Section 403.19 and generated by the construction of the Minimum Improvements, the cumulative total for all such payments not to exceed the lesser of (i) \$1,900,000 or (ii) the actual costs of the Public Improvements, under the terms and following satisfaction of the conditions set forth in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement further proposes that the City will be responsible for receiving and using the portion of the Tax Increments required to be used for low and moderate income (LMI) housing assistance (approximately 41.12%) and will comply with all provisions of Chapter 403 relating to such use, under the terms and following satisfaction of the terms set forth in the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Chapters 15A and 403, Code of Iowa, (the "Urban Renewal Law") authorize cities and counties to make grants for economic development in furtherance of the objectives of

an urban renewal project and to appropriate such funds and make such expenditures as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of said Chapter, and to levy taxes and assessments for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that the Agreement is in the best interests of the City and the residents thereof and that the performance by the City of its obligations thereunder is a public undertaking and purpose and in furtherance of the Plan and the Urban Renewal Law and, further, that the Agreement and the City's performance thereunder is in furtherance of appropriate economic development activities and objectives of the City within the meaning of Chapters 15A and 403, Code of Iowa, taking into account the factors set forth therein; and

Subject: Safe Building Services Agreement

BACKGROUND: In your packet for consideration on Monday is an updated service agreement from Safe Building. The agreement outlines permitting and zoning code enforcement. The fee structure is not changing, and the breakdown of fees will remain as is, but they are outlined in the agreement and are based on total valuation of each project.

The agreement also outlines an hourly rate for code enforcement at \$75. Code enforcement seems to be an area we are lacking in, and this will help alleviate that. This is simply to follow-up when a nuisance becomes aware to us, and we ask Safe Building to go complete an inspection. They will not drive around looking for nuisances but will only follow-up when city staff directs them to. I believe this will assist the City until we decide the time is necessary to have a code enforcement position on staff.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the agreement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: There are no new financial considerations at this point. The fee structure is not changing, and Safe Building has been assisting us with code enforcement on an as needed basis. This simply outlines all their services into one document.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approve the service agreement with Safe Building.



SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Services Agreement ("**Agreement**") is made and entered into this _____ day of (month) 2020 (the "**Effective Date**") by and between Safe Building ("**Contractor**") and the City of (city) ("**City**").

1. <u>Services to be Provided</u>. Contractor shall provide those services detailed in Schedule A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter referred to as the "Services").

2. <u>Compensation</u>. In consideration of Contractor's Services hereunder, City shall pay Contractor the fees outlined in Schedule B, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Schedule B may be revised by Contractor unilaterally every twelve (12) months by providing City with sixty (60) days prior written notice of the new fee schedule. All payments under the Agreement shall be due upon receipt of Contractor's invoice and payable no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice. Contractor reserves the right to cease providing Services at any time due to City's failure to make timely payment.

In the event City fails to pay any invoice in a timely manner and Contractor takes action to collect such amounts, City shall be responsible for all costs and fees, including legal fees, Contractor incurred in enforcing this Agreement.

3. <u>Term and Termination</u>. The initial term of this Agreement will begin on the Effective Date and shall continue for one (1) year unless earlier terminated (the "**Term**"). The Term shall automatically renew for successive one year terms. In any event, this Agreement may be terminated by either party with or without cause by giving the other party thirty (30) days prior written notice.

4. <u>**Relationship of the Parties.**</u> The parties hereto are independent contractors. This Agreement does not constitute and shall not be construed in any manner so as to create between these parties a joint venture, employment relationship, agency agreement, partnership or any other relationship other than that of independent contractors, except that Contractor shall be treated as Building Official, Electrical Code Official, Plumbing Code Official and Mechanical Code Official or other applicable official for the City for the purposes of code enforcement as set out by the International Code Council.

5. **<u>Responsibility, Indemnification and Limitation of Liability</u>**. Contractor makes no warranty relating to any City provided materials and does not warrant any action or inaction by City and has no responsibility therefore. Contractor makes no representations regarding the accuracy of City provided materials which are and remain the exclusive responsibility of the City.



The International Code Council sets forth guidelines for the indemnification of Contractor and for the purposes of this Agreement, City accepts such guidelines, a copy of which is attached hereto as Schedule C, and agrees to indemnify and defend Contractor from any and all claims arising out of the performance of this Agreement in any form including all statutory and common law claims except those of gross negligence. City shall not indemnify Contractor for employee issues such as workers' compensation and wage hour issues.

6. <u>Miscellaneous Provisions</u>. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the express written consent of the other party. This Agreement is for the benefit of the parties hereto and there shall be no third-party beneficiary. This Agreement may not be amended unless done so in writing, signed by both parties, and approved by the City Council; provided however, Schedule B may be amended by Contractor as provided for in Section 2. The invalidity of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa.

SCHEDULE A - Services

Permitted plan review and inspection services:

The Services to be provided under this Agreement include, but are not limited to Building, Electrical, Mechanical and Plumbing and (*Zoning Code Enforcement) based on the City's most recently adopted International Code Council Codes, the National Electrical Code, and the City's Code of Ordinances.

- Review building permits, plans, and other construction documents for residential and commercial projects.
- Review and approve trade permits.
- Provide owners, contractors, and city with plan review notes with approved building permits upon completion of plan review.
- Conduct required inspections throughout project until construction is finished, and project is complete. Generally Safe Building is responsible for all work inside the lot line with the exceptions of sewer/water/storm, sidewalk, and approach inspections. We will also verify sod/seed is established prior to new construction being closed.
- Provide city with documentation of completion of projects.
- Field questions throughout review and inspection process.
- Site and street cleanliness during construction.

Unpermitted Services – Building nuisance and work without a permit:

Inspections, reports, and consulting for nuisance properties provided to the City based on the current adopted International Property Maintenance Code, Dangerous Buildings chapter 145 in the city ordinances, and/or any applicable city or state codes can be completed at City's request at any time. The following items are covered during the nuisance process:

- Investigation/Inspection documentation.
- Report of findings complete with pictures and code/ ordinance references.
- Collaboration with City, City attorney and other team members to prepare necessary legal paperwork.
- Follow up consulting, court preparation and appearances and other work related to court.

* Zoning is a "joint" effort between Safe Building, City personal and City engineering.

SCHEDULE C - FROM THE ADMINISTRATION SECTION OF THE 2012 INTERNATIONAL CODES

104.8 Liability. The building official, member of the board of appeals or employee charged with the enforcement of this code, while acting for the jurisdiction in good faith and without malice in the discharge of the duties required by this code or other pertinent law or ordinance, shall not thereby be rendered liable personally and is hereby relieved from personal liability for any damage accruing to persons or property as a result of any act or by reason of an act or omission in the discharge of official duties. Any suit instituted against an officer or employee because of an act performed by that officer or employee in the lawful discharge of duties and under the provisions of this code shall be defended by legal representative of the jurisdiction until the final termination of the proceedings. The building official or any subordinate shall not be liable for cost in any action, suit or proceeding that is instituted in pursuance of the provisions of this code.

Subject: 2020 Lawn Care Services

BACKGROUND: It is time to approve the mowing and lawn care programs for the 2020 growing season. As you may remember, in 2017 we went out for bids on the mowing and lawn care services (fertilization and weed control). Total Quality Inc was the successful bidder. We placed in the bid documents that if Polk City so choses we could renew the contract annually, up to 4 more years (2021), if both parties agree on the conditions.

I met with Charlie Husack, Owner of Total Quality Inc and we came up with an amended plan that will save \$942 per year on the weed control portion. If you look at the price list provided, we are adding more areas that need to be treated, they are in marked in red under the Lawn Care column. To help offset the new areas to be treated and reduce the cost, we went from a 5-step program in some areas to a less costly 3- step program.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not extend contract

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The per mowing price stays the same as last year at \$3,377. Also, as a cost saving measure we reduced the number of mowing's per year from 25 to 20. To be clear we will mow as many times as needed to keep the city looking good but if there are times when we can stretch from once per week to 10 days to reduce the total number of times we mow, we will.

Total Quality Inc.\$3,377 per mowing (one time)\$19,279 per growing season (fertilization and weed control)

The contract calls for once per week mowing (as needed) on all properties and twice a week mowing at the Town Square and Sports Complex. It also calls for a 5 – Step or 3- step application programs in most turf areas and a 7 – step application program at the Sports Complex

RECOMMENDATION: As you all know Total Quality Inc. has provided these services in the past and has performed very well for Polk City. I would recommend approval for both the mowing and fertilization/weed control contracts with Total Quality Inc.

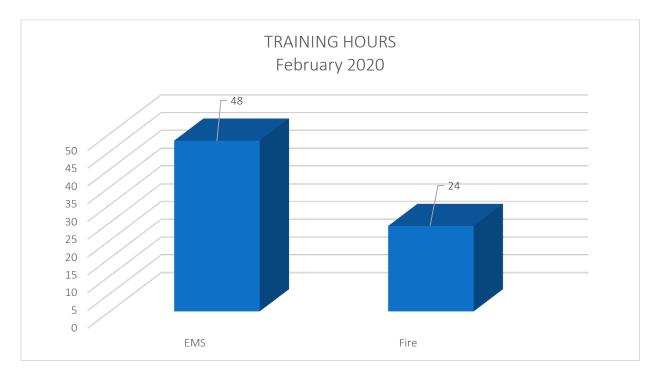

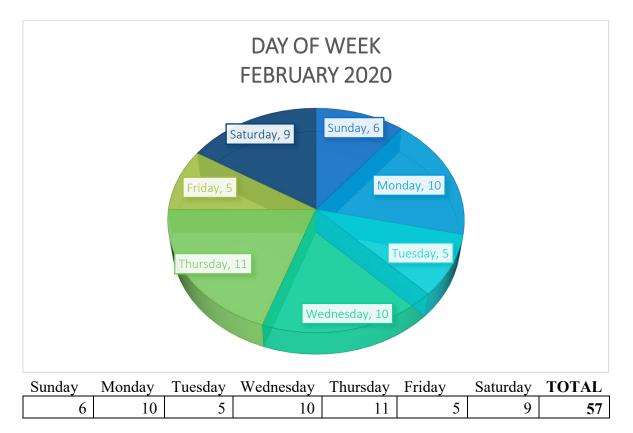

BACKGROUND: February 2020 was not quite as busy as February 2019. PCFD had a total of 61 calls for service during February 2019 and 57 this year.

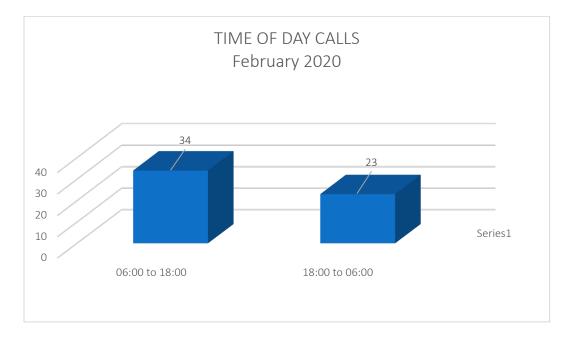

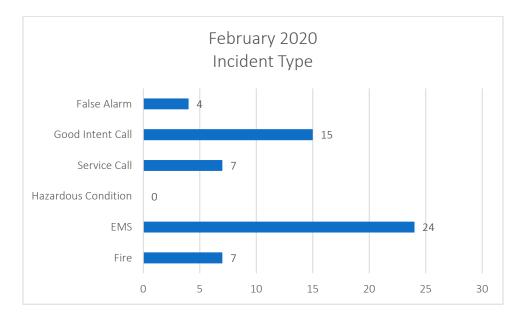


The call volume was busiest on Thursday with 11 calls for service in February:

WHEREAS, the developer has provided a Certified Check in the amount of \$12,600 to Polk City as security for the completion of all remaining Punchlist items. All Punchlist items shall be completed by September 1, 2020, upon completion, said security will be released to the Developer by Resolution of City Council; and

WHEREAS, no permanent Certificates of Occupancy shall be issued until the public improvements are ready to be accepted by City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and the City Attorney recommend approval of the Agreement to Complete for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa hereby accepts the recommendations of the City Engineer and the City Attorney and deems it appropriate to approve the Agreement to Complete for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2.

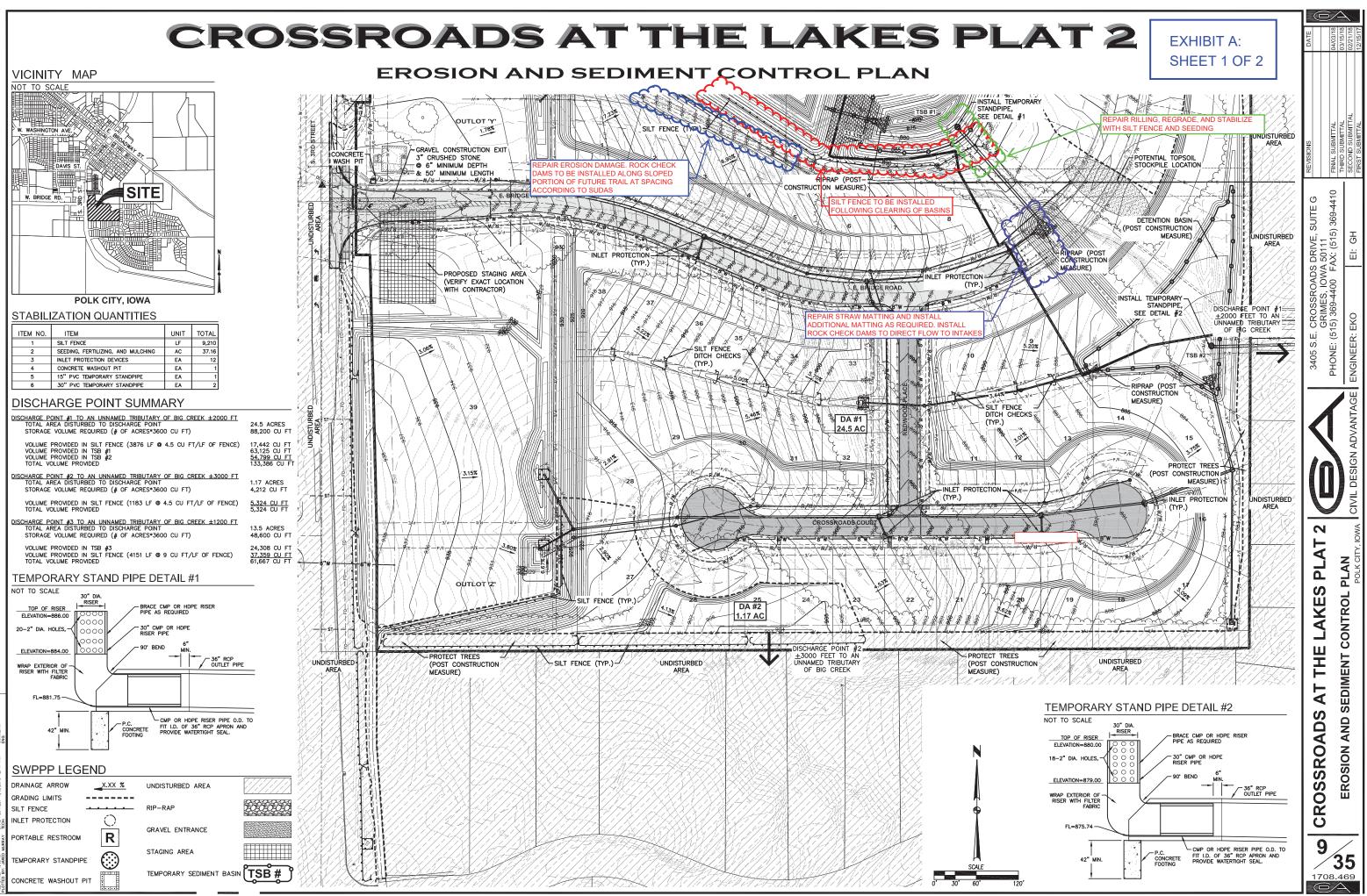


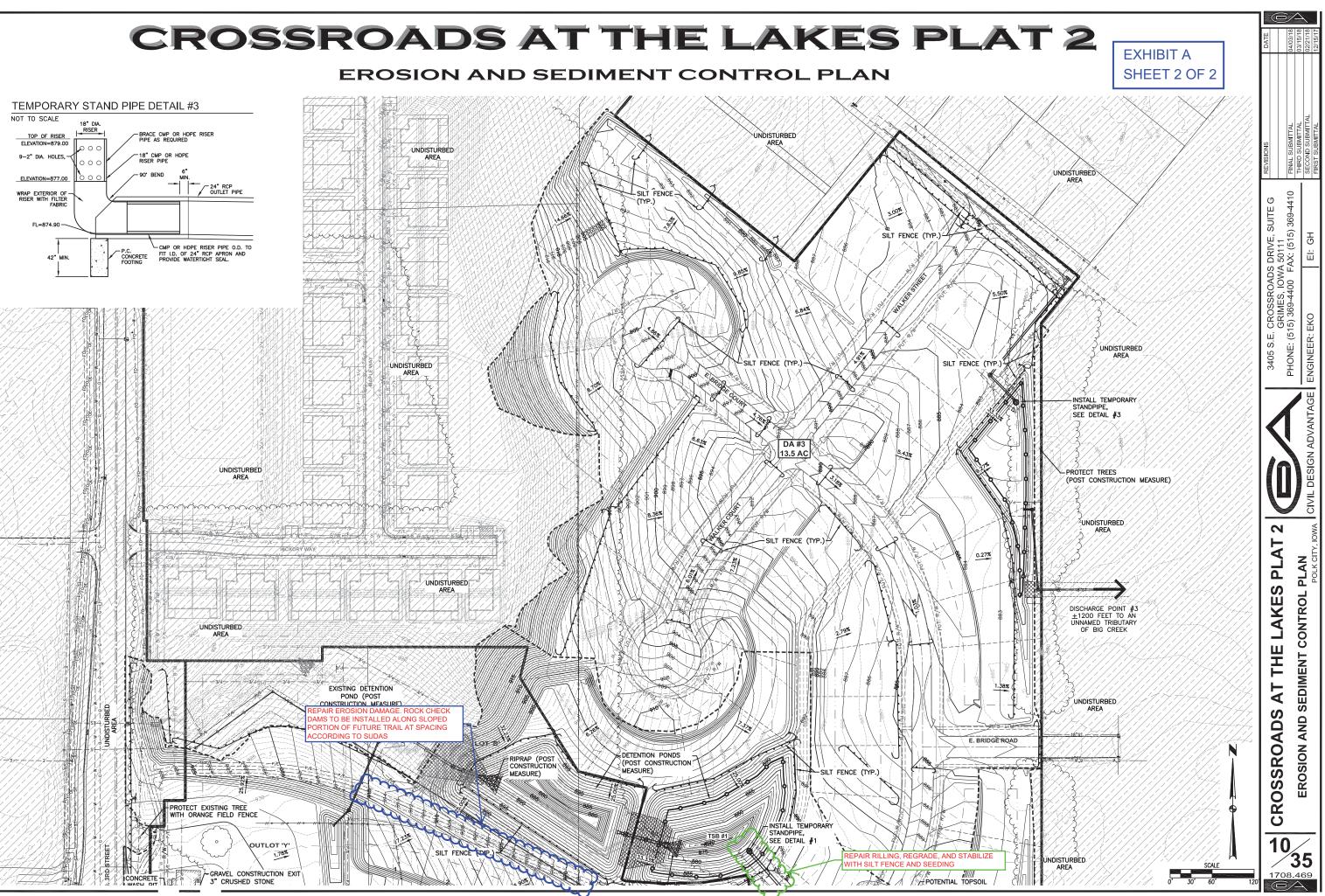

The following items shall be completed prior to Council acceptance of the public improvements:

- 1. Remove sediment from all detention basins, including two wet-bottom ponds and two drybottom basins, unless as-built survey demonstrates compliance with approved construction drawings. Provide as-built survey to demonstrate grading of all basins conforms to plans. Clean out storm sewer and riprap if necessary.
- 2. Re-seed and over seed as necessary at all detention basins to stabilize all slopes. Install silt fence to stabilize after work is complete. (Refer to attached Exhibit A developed on site during walk-thru.)
- 3. Repair erosion and straw mat at the hydrant and valve located just beyond the end of pavement markers. Install additional erosion control devices as needed to stabilize this area, including a rock check dam to direct pavement runoff toward the intakes. (Refer to Exhibit A.)
- 4. Remove the remaining traffic control devices along S. 3rd Street and construction debris remaining on Lot 39.
- 5. Repair grading at rills, including on future trail. Install and/or repair erosion control as needed to stabilize site; coordinate with Deb Beck on this issue. (Refer to Exhibit A.)
- 6. As per Storm Sewer Video Inspection Review, clean riprap on outlet pipe in detention basin 2D on Lot 15. Clean out storm sewer pipe if necessary per direction from Deb Beck.
- 7. Complete pavement markings on the approach to 3rd Street in accordance with approved Construction Drawings. Pavement markings as installed are not acceptable. Pavement markings shall be in accordance with Sheet 31 of the approved construction drawings and shall be durable pavement markings.
- 8. Developer's Engineer shall provide as-built survey following clean out of all detention basins/ponds. All as-built survey will need to include professional seals and date of survey.
- 9. Reimburse City for all Engineering review fees.

AGREEMENT TO COMPLETE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS CROSSROADS AT THE LAKES PLAT 2

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into as of the ____ day of _____, 2020, by and Kimberley Development Corporation, c/o Bill Kimberley, 2785 N, Ankeny Boulevard, Ankeny IA 50023; an Iowa Corporation ("Developer") and the City of Polk City, Iowa, an Iowa municipal corporation, ("Polk City").

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2018, the City of Polk City approved the Construction Drawings for Public Improvements for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2018, the City of Polk City approved the Final Plat, including Subdivision Bonds, for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has substantially completed construction of the public improvements in accordance with said approved Construction Drawings for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2, however certain public improvements have not yet been completed by the Developer to the satisfaction of Polk City; and

WHEREAS, the Developer is desirous of the issuance of Building Permits for lots within said Plat 2 in accordance with the regulations and requirements of Polk City subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of Polk City approving said plat and in further consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Developer has not yet completed the attached Punchlist #6 dated March 6, 2020. Developer shall complete these Punchlist items (the "Improvements") in accordance with Polk City specifications and the approved Construction Drawings.
- 2. Developer has provided a certified check in the amount of <u>\$75,000</u> to the City of Polk City as security for the completion of a portion of said Punchlist; specifically Punchlist Items #1, #4 and #6 as well as the rock check at the end of E. Bridge Road included as part of Item #3. These Punchlist items shall be completed by April 30, 2020. Upon completion, said security will be released to the Developer by Resolution of City Council.
- 3. Developer has provided a certified check in the amount of <u>\$12,600</u> to Polk City as security for the completion of all remaining Punchlist items. All Punchlist items shall be completed by September 1, 2020. Upon completion, said security will be released to the Developer by Resolution of City Council.

- 4. In consideration of the Polk City's receipt of the aforementioned security and the developer's agreement to fulfill their obligation to complete the public improvements; Polk City agrees to issue Building Permits and Temporary Certificates of Occupancy in accordance with Polk City Municipal Code, including applicable Building Codes. Once all punchlist items have been completed, other than confirmation that grass has been fully established, permanent Certificates of Occupancy shall be issued in accordance with city building code requirements.
- 5. Developer agrees that in the event Developer fails to complete the Improvements in accordance with this Agreement, upon receipt of any invoice therefor, Polk City shall use the funds provided by the Developer to pay any and all actual costs incurred by Polk City for legal services, engineering services including construction observation, contractor services, and/or services of other persons or entities employed by Polk City (other than Polk City staff personnel) for, or any way involved in, the review, construction, and inspection of Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2 and all Improvements intended for public use or benefit or to be constructed or caused to be constructed by the Developer.
- 6. Following completion of all items on aforementioned Punchlist, including establishment of grass, and payment of all fees, the Public Improvements for Crossroads at the Lakes Plat 2 shall be accepted by the City Council of Polk City.

Subject: Sanitary Sewer Rate Ordinance

BACKGROUND: On Monday, the Council will have the second reading of the sewer rate Ordinance with the new proposed rates which will go into effect for the July utility bills. Listed below are the changes the Council agreed to during the budget process (The City Council's "mark-up" bills were accurate to this structure):

For the purpose of simplifying the bills, and because I think it would be better to just have one set fee, and then usage in addition to the fee, I am recommending to the Council that we consolidate the Rock Creek Usage Fee and the Usage Fee. The availability fee will increase slightly with this scenario to \$17.30, and the new usage fee will be \$11.35 per 1,000 gallons-thus increasing higher end users more. Therefore, the NEW proposed ordinance in front of you for Monday evening shows the following rates.

ALTERNATIVES: Do not approve the sanitary sewer rate increases.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: If the City does not increase the sewer rates, we will be operating negatively in the sewer fund next Fiscal Year. The City hired a consultant last year, PFM, to evaluate both the water and the sewer funds. After evaluation of both of those funds, PFM gave 5 options to the City Council for consideration on how to increase the sanitary sewer funds. The Council wanted to have the least impact on the lower end users, and the larger impact on higher end users, so they selected option 2.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation that the Council approve the second reading of the Sewer rate Ordinance. This Ordinance will not take effect until July 1st, therefore there is no need to waive 3rd reading of the Ordinance and the Council can just have that reading occur at the April 13th meeting.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 99, SECTION 99.02, SEWER SERVICE CHARGES

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Polk City, Iowa:

Section 1. The Polk City Code, Chapter 99, Section 99.02, Sewer Service Charges, is hereby amended by deleting the section and inserting the following:

99.02 SEWER SERVICE. Each customer shall pay sewer service charges for the use of and for the service supplied by the municipal sanitary sewer system as follows:

1. Service Availability Charge. A service availability charge of \$17.30 per month (minimum bill).

2. Usage Charge. A usage charge of \$11.35 per each 1,000 gallons of water used.

Section 2. The new Sanitary Sewer rates will start with meter reads in the month of June 2020, payable in July 2020.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
