Polk City, City Council held a meeting in the City Hall Council Chambers with public participation in person and via phone at 6:00 p.m., January 23, 2022. The agenda was posted at the City Hall office as required by law.

  - a. Mayor Karsjen opened the Public Hearing on Amending the 2016 Polk City Comprehensive Plan by Updating the Future Land Use Map at 6:02pm. City Clerk Coffin said that the notice was published January 13. 2023 and no comments had been received for or against the amendment. Erin Ollendike, Civil Design Advantage on behalf of Parable Ventures, LLC reviewed the request for modification of the City's Comprehensive Plan, Future land Use Map for the rezoning request of 78 acres near the intersection at NW 126<sup>th</sup> and Sheldahl Drive. Travis Thornburgh, City Engineer, provided a report and recommendation. No one was present to be heard for or against the amendment.

  - iii. MOTION: A motion was made by Vogel and seconded by Walters to approve Resolution 2023-16 Approving Construction Contract and Bond to GTG in the amount of \$1,171,000 MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY
- b. City Manager Huisman asked Council to set the Public Hearing for the FY24 Maximum Property Tax Levy for the operating levy. She stated that she's not proposing to increase the current rate, however, is asking Council to set the maximum at a higher rate of \$9.75 per \$1000 to allow flexibility for the Council to react to what the State Legislation does in the next few months. She reiterated this doesn't mean \$9.75 would be the operating levy rate, just setting the hearing at this rate to allow for the maximum the City could set in the budget. Huisman said the Council would hold the hearing for the Maximum Property Tax Levy on February 27<sup>th</sup> and at that meeting the Council would set the hearing for the Budget Adoption.
