- 10. Reports & Particulars | Mayor, Council, City Manager, Staff, Boards, and/or Commissions
 - Parks & Recreation Director Jason Thraen thanked the Polk City Friends of the Park for organizing the fundraiser Run, and he thanked all the sponsors and volunteers that helped make it a successful event. Thraen reported that the Sports Complex sustained some damage during the high wind event over the weekend, and staff is working to clean up the areas as fast as possible.
 - City Manager Huisman reported that the P&Z Commission had reviewed the Future Land Use Plan and offered some suggestions on updates, and they will be discussing it again at the May 16th meeting to move things along for a formal recommendation to Council. Huisman shared that City Clerk, Jenny Coffin was awarded two scholarships to attend the National Clerk's Conference in May.
 - Council Member Sarchet said he is happy to see the Citizen Academy being offered again this Fall. He thanked the Friends of the Park group for offering opportunities for new faces to get involved and offer some help for the Parks Department, Parks Commission and Arbor League.
 - Council Member Vogel said her family enjoyed the Run Fundraising Event and spending time on the square. She said thank you to Staff for the work that went into the CIP and reviewing what has already been accomplished and adjusting where needed and getting the plan updated.
 - Council Member Anderson encouraged youth groups and others to get involved and help clean up the entryways into Polk City. Parks & Recreation Director Thraen shared that Principal Richards from the Middle School has scheduled the 8th graders to help with clean up efforts May 24th, and Council Member Vogel encouraged everyone to help and pick up trash when you see it since it has been such a windy season.

- Council Member Dvorak said he is thankful for the work the PD is accomplishing with 20 arrests in March involving several felons. He said Polk City is very fortunate to have officers doing good work to keep Polk City Safe and having Eudoris doing his part sniffing out crime and keeping the community safe.
- Council Member Walters thanked Library Director Noack for the continued educational programs and fun events offered like the recent May Basket crafts.
- Mayor Karsjen said he enjoyed rooting everyone on at the fundraiser race and thanked everyone that worked hard to put the event on, he said it was great to see over 150 at the first organized event for the Friends of the Park group.
