# Plan Purpose and Scope







#### **PURPOSE & SCOPE**

Polk City is a fast-growing and vibrant community that's home to an engaged citizenry willing to bring their backgrounds and professional expertise to bear on planning for the city's future. Over the past few years, Polk City residents have stepped up to provide input on several planning documents and exercises. Using these and other planning activities, the goal of the Explore Polk City core and advisory planning groups was to assemble a competitive application for the Iowa Great Places program that contains a carefully thought out "vision" based on identifiable community goals that we can track for success from beginning to end. We have an excellent idea of what makes our community great; now it's time to move to the next step by developing a Vision Plan our community can enthusiastically support and follow into the future.

Adhering closely to the program designation guidelines outlined by the Iowa Great Places program, we have focused our strategic planning on eight core program areas, including Arts & Culture, Architecture, Diversity, Entrepreneurial Incentive for Business Development, Historic Fabric, Housing Options, Natural Environment, and Amenities.

#### **PLAN PROCESS**

We created our Vision Plan by drawing upon numerous documents, including our Imagine Polk City, A Bridge to the Future comprehensive plan, our various trails study documents, and our Community Visioning and other plans as well as input from a diverse set of residents and community leaders. Input into the process included information from the following key documents:

- 1. 2015 High Trestle Trail Connector study and 2022 update
- 2. 2016 Polk City, Imagine Polk City, A Bridge to the Future Comprehensive Plan
- 3. 2020 Iowa State University City-wide Survey
- 4. 2020 Facility Needs Assessment
- 5. 2021 Downtown Connectivity Trails Study
- 6. 2021 Community Visioning Plan
- 7. 2021 Polk City Community Survey
- 8. 2021 Regional Parks Master Plans
- 9. 2022 Sidewalk Connectivity Analysis
- 10. The 2023 Downtown Assessment Report (final report anticipated in Spring 2023)
- 11. Thirty Polk City residents and business owners participated in Core and Advisory Group planning. The Advisory group was asked to complete a survey to generate additional ideas on projects related to the eight core areas. These individuals were invited to provide their comments electronically or at a special meeting organized by the Explore Polk City Core committee, or both.
- 12. The Advisory group reviewed the Vision Plan and provided revisions.



# What Makes Polk City Great?







• Saylorville Lake includes 26,000 acres of water stretching 50 miles up the Des Moines River Valley to Polk City. The lake, campgrounds, and parks bring boaters, skiers, anglers and campers. Further Saylorville Marina is home to central lowa's only floating bar/restaurant.







• Big Creek State Park is a family-friendly park boasting the largest beach in Iowa's state park system. Big Creek also hosts great fishing and biking opportunities, including access to the Neil Smith Trail.







• Our proximity to Saylorville Lake and Big Creek State Park brings over **2.2 million visitors** to the area annually. Many of those visitors stop by Polk City for dining, shopping, and other tourism activities.











#### WHAT MAKES US GREAT?

- The High Trestle Trail (HTT) is a 25-mile bike trail, passing through five towns and four counties and provides easy riding for all age levels. Polk City is partnering with Polk County Conservation and local landowners to become the link that joins Central Iowa's newest trail, the High Trestle Trail, to Iowa's oldest trail, the Neal Smith Trail. Polk City plans to construct a 1.1 mile section called the "Polk City Connector" to this trail in 2023.
- Iowa's Neal Smith Bike Trail, traversing through Polk City, hosts cyclists and other users from around the world.











#### WHAT MAKES US GREAT?

The Tournament Club of Iowa golf course is Iowa's only Arnold Palmer-designed golf. TCI's beautiful 18-hole course encompasses 500 acres in Polk City. The course is open to the public, offering golf, simulated golf, dining, and event space.





Polk City's Town Square is the only historic Square in Polk County and has been voted one of the nine most beautiful Squares in Iowa. The Square is a one-acre community park surrounded by restaurants, shops and local businesses and houses the city's historic bandstand and other features.





Community festivals are abound in Polk City. These include the Four Seasons Festival in July, FallFest in October, and the Light up Polk City tree lighting ceremony in December. Hosting over 10,000 visitors each year, these festivals are designed to promote family fun and community spirit.











# **Explore Polk City Vision**







### **VISION STATEMENT**

Polk City's vision is to exude a vibrancy that accentuates our arts and culture, and historic, charming and diverse family-friendly community, while supporting commercial growth and developing our reputation as "Central lowa's recreation destination."

#### SUPPORTING STATEMENT

Our goals and objectives are centered around the core program areas outlined by the Iowa Great Places program. These goals are focused on helping advance our commercial growth as well as nurture and showcase the many natural opportunities our community provides for enhanced quality of life. Ultimately, we want to continue to see Polk City prosper as a welcoming community for all. Our goals build upon the many suggestions that have come out of our many planning documents.

Polk City is recognized for its environmental and recreational setting. Surrounded by dramatic bluffs and running ravines, the community has true authenticity, with focuses on quality of life, culture, and recreation. Tournament Club of Iowa is known as a destination, to visitors across both the State of Iowa and the Country. Through the Iowa Great Places designation, we would focus on continuing to showcase this state-of-the-art facility.

With an abundance of park and lake opportunities, the community also benefits from one of the most notable trail systems in the state. The Neal Smith Trail connects Big Creek State Park to the John Pat Dorrian Trail in downtown Des Moines. The High Trestle Trail is located approximately one mile to the east of the corporate limits and provides additional recreational connectivity in Central Iowa. One of the communities' priorities is to connect these two central lowa trail systems in the coming years.

Polk City's Town Square is also a prime placemaking location. The community is focused around the Town Square, and is always seeking opportunities to enhance the public space, often referred to as the "heart of the community." The Town Square is a quality place to many residents and visitors of Polk City, with businesses surrounding the commercial district, and an open park space in the center. The Town Square is always bustling, and our vision for the Town Square is to continue to enhance the space and to further make it a tourism destination to eat, drink, and shop locally.







# Plan Implementation







### PLAN IMPLEMENTATION AND EVALUATION METRICS

The Explore Polk City Core committee will be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Vision Plan, in partnership with the Iowa Great Places Advisory group and City of Polk City.

A special meeting will be called each year to review and celebrate achievements as well as plan for the following year's projects. Should new opportunities be identified or manifest themselves, these will be reviewed for addition to the overall plan. Explore Polk City Core committee will consider the Plan a living document with a focus on completing projects and adding new opportunities, when appropriate. Attention will be given to ensure the goals and obligations of the Iowa Great Places program are met.

#### WHAT DOES SUCCESS LOOK LIKE?

Though some of our goals will be easily measurable through the annual review process, such as establishing an art gallery or expanding a trail, many goals are harder to quantify, since their impact is relatively subjective and/or ongoing. We will have to regularly look at several additional factors to determine if we have been successful. Success will be measured via:

- 1. Regular communication with businesses to determine success resulting from Vision Plan.
- Connecting the Neal Smith Trail to the High Trestle Trail through Polk City.
- Downtown square growth and prosperity through the addition of new restaurants and other entertainment venues.

- Our tourism industry prospers through increased measurable tourist traffic using our trails and supporting our business both on our Square and Bridge Road.
- Art of all kinds becomes commonplace along our streets and in our public spaces.
- Our residents know our history and share it with others.
- Existing businesses expand and new businesses locate here.
- Have park-space and/or trails located within 0.25 miles of every residential property in town.
